President Eisenhower, who with

the first lady headed the guest list, showed up in a tuxedo with black sequin-embroidered, off-the-shoulder, long blue taffeta gown. Mrs. John Allen, wife of an assistant postmaster general, wore short blue lace. Mrs. Herbert Brownell, wife of the attorney general, was in dark brown taffeta. And Mrs. Nathan Twining, wife of the Air Force chief of staff, wore champagne-colored silk trimmed with dark red velvet.

The President and other dinner-coated gentlemen, including Chief Justice Earl Warren and Sherman Adams, presidential assistant, looked very comfortable indeed as they settled back to listen to the concert.

"You can't compare Washington's symphony opening with New York's 'Diamond Horseshoe' Metropolitan Opera spurge," Dr. Glenn Dillard Gunn, veteran music critic, reminded me. "This is an intellectual affair, for real music lovers not a show case for fancy dress and monkeyshines."

The ladies highlighted in the boxes, however, took the occasion to don their newest gowns, furs and jewels. Mrs. Charles Wilson,

wife of the secretary of defense, wore expensive white mink over a sequin-embroidered, off-the-shoulder, long blue taffeta gown. did Mrs. Wilson. The President obviously enjoyed the concert, which began with some Beethoven, followed by Barber, and was highlighted by the magnificent singing of the London Metropolitan Opera baritone.

### Confirmation Settled Naming, Byrnes Says

WASHINGTON (AP) — James F. Byrnes told senators Thursday he is satisfied former President Truman would have stopped confirmation of the late Harry Dexter White's appointment to the International Monetary Fund in 1949 had the Senate not already approved the nomination.

Byrnes, who was secretary of state at the time, made the statement in a telegraph reply to questions submitted to him by the Senate internal security subcommittee.

This added little to the public statement Byrnes made last Monday when he said he talked with Truman about an FBI report linking White to Communist activities, suggested withdrawing White's nomination; and that Truman made a telephone call and learned White had already been confirmed by the Senate.

### Great Political Weekend for Salem

SALEM (AP) — Salem will be a center of political activity this weekend, with the state Young Republican convention and an address by U. S. Sen. Wayne Morse.

The two-day convention opens Friday, Gov. Paul L. Patterson will speak at the Saturday night banquet.

Morse said he would speak on encroachments upon American freedom by political expediency.

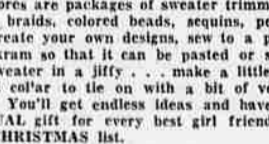
