New TB Drugs May Halve Hospital Stay

NEW YORK (AP) — Potent new anti-tuberculosis drugs can cut in half the hospital stay of many TB patients, with home treatment completing the cure, four Pittsburgh physicians said today.
This go-home-early method seems to work successfully for persons who respond to drugs, they told the American Public Health Assn.
Of 173 men and women sent home early, only seven later had to return to the hospital, said Doctors Merle Bundy, George E. Martin, I. Alexander and Carl G. Kozlin, Pittsburgh Department of Health.

For the persons who react well to the drug, the usual long hospital stay is being reduced 50 per cent. But, they said, this new treatment method needs further study to determine its real value. Patients visit a clinic each month and careful tabs are kept upon them in their home treatment.

Isoniazid streptomycin and Pas are the drugs used in the hospital and continued at home for one to two years. No bad reactions have been noted from the daily doses of these drugs, Dr. Bundy said.

Of 111 patients taking isoniazid at home, only three failed to stay well.
Of 62 taking streptomycin and Pas, four had to return.

Sackett's Deal Falls Through

Genuine U.S. \$3 Bill Turns Up

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP)—Anything may turn up on Friday the 13th, including a \$3 bill. It's genuine. Such assurances from the Treasury Department were welcome news to Wilson K. Beatty. The attorney has a client—not identified—who put up \$500 for the bill, then began wondering about its authenticity.
He was told the certificate, about the size of today's greenbacks, was issued on government authority by the Mechanics Bank of Georgetown, D. C., Nov. 26, 1862. Printed only on one side, it has a bald eagle on the face and a symbol of the 13 original states.
Now that Beatty knows the bill isn't counterfeit, he's carrying it clipped to a small poster which asks:
"What's so queer about a three dollar bill?"

Grange Told, What Happens To Farmer, Happens to U.S.

BURLINGTON, Vt. (AP) — The economic and the military security of the nation depends upon what happens to the American Farmer. Sen. George D. Aiken (R-Vt.) told the 87th annual convention of the National Grange Friday.

Sen. Aiken is chairman of the Committee on Agriculture which is to begin work with the resumption of congressional sessions in January on bills for amendments to the farm program.

The farm program to be developed by the Republican administration, Aiken said in a prepared speech, "will not be developed by a few agricultural economists nor by a few politicians in any smoke-filled room."

Instead, he said, the program will be shaped on the farms and in the rural communities.

That's why, he added, Secretary of Agriculture Ezra T. Benson and Aiken's own committee invited the Grange and other farm organizations to make their own recommendations for the future farm program.

Aiken said the various groups may not agree on all aspects of the program, "but the composite thinking of all our rural people will not be very far from right." The farm program of the future he said, will be something like

this:
1. — We expect to secure the production of an adequate amount of food and fiber to feed and clothe our people and to meet the needs of our export trade.

2. — A good farm program should undertake to secure for the American farmer his proper share of our national economic prosperity.

3. — By maintaining the purchasing power of the American farmer at a reasonably high level, we insure the economic prosperity of the nation as a whole and particularly which provides gainful employment and a healthy standard of living for millions of people who
