CHARGES PERSECUTION — Former Asst. Atty. Gen. Herbert Bergson, indicted by a federal grand jury in Washington on charges that he violated the so-called "conflict of interest" law, has countered with a statement accusing Atty. Gen. Herbert Brownell of political persecution. The law prohibits former federal employees representing clients having "claims" against the Government until two years after leaving federal service if they handled the case while in office.

Bum Check Charge Filed

Picked up on suspicion of stealing Preston anti-freeze from the Balsiger Motor Co., Harold Harry Moore, 57, after considerable questioning Monday denied he had taken the anti-freeze but confessed that he had passed a bogus check at the J. C. Penney Co. store.

He was arraigned on a charge of forgery and bail set at \$2,000.

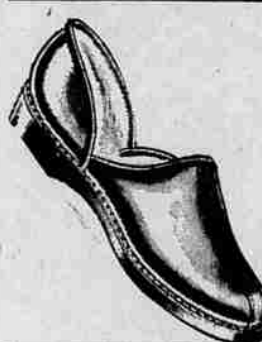
