TV Channel At Portland Draws Okay

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Communications Commission examiner Tuesday recommended Oregon Television, Inc., be authorized to operate a Channel 12 television station at Portland, Ore.

Examiner Elizabeth Smith also recommended that competing applications of Columbia Empire Telecasters, Inc., and Northwest Television & Broadcasting Co. for the same channel be denied. Oregon Television Inc. is a newly formed group of Portland business and professional men, headed by Henry A. White retired banker and broker. Columbia Empire Telecasters was organized by the Journal Publishing Co. and other business interests in Portland. The Journal Co. also owns radio stations KPOJ and KPOJ-FM. Northwest Television is headed by John D. Keating, a part owner of KONA-TV, Honolulu, and radio station KYA, San Francisco, and who has broadcasting interests elsewhere. Examiner Smith said that all three applicants were legally, technically, financially and otherwise qualified for a TV license. She concluded, however, that Oregon Television should be preferred "on the factor of local ownership," on program proposals, and in the interest of diversifying control of mass communications.

Winged Victory Had Cast Of Future Day Wonders

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Ten years ago this week a show called "Winged Victory" opened on Broadway. Today no producer could afford to assemble the distinguished alumni of that production.

The producer of "Winged Victory" was the United States Army Air Forces, and the proceeds went to Army relief. The military charity respected a sizable profit, since the picture sale to 20th Century-Fox alone amounted to a million dollars.

The show, the brainchild of Moss Hart, was a melange of music, comedy and sentiment. Perhaps its most notable feature was the cast, few members of which earned more than \$50 a month. One of the players, Barry Nelson, was reminiscing about the show. "Barry, now starring in 'My Favorite Husband' on CBS-TV Saturday nights, told about one of the members of the chorus whom he got to know well. This fellow was bitter about Army life. Some people take out their troubles in drinking, but he ate. He reached around 300 pounds. His name: Mario P. ... Another young man did a short monologue at the opening of the show and later imitated Carmen Miranda. He was an unknown then, but people now know him as Red Buttons. Oh, there were lots of others. ... Peter Lind Hayes, then known principally as Grace Hayes' son... Edmond O'Brien, Don Taylor, Gary Merrill, who became more famous in films later ... Karl Malden, who won an Oscar for 'A Streetcar Named Desire' ... Kevin McCarthy, who got a nomination for 'Death of a Salesman' ... George Reeves, now the 'Superman' of TV ... Ray Middleton, who hit with 'Ethel Merman in 'Annie Get Your Gun' ... John Forsythe of films and 'Tea House of the August Moon' ... Eugene Conley of the Met ... and others like Lon McCallister, Mark Daniels, Alan Baxter, Dave Rose, Joe Bushkin. One of the girls in the show was Phyllis Avery, who plays Ray Milland's wife on TV and married Don Taylor (they're now separated). Also in the picture was a girl named Judith Tuvim. She's better known as Judy Holiday now. "It was quite a cast," said Barry Nelson, looking back at the show. "We were chosen from thousands of Air Force men who tried out for it. The selection was limited to those who had been in show business, since there had to be some starting point. "Nearly all of us were making \$50 a month or less. There were a few officers in the cast, but they had minor roles. It was a funny thing—the officers seemed to be lesser lights in civilian life than the enlisted men." The show played six months in New York, and most of the ac-

tors were quartered at a hotel that had been taken over by the Air Force. A few were allowed to make their own homes, and Nelson admitted that he almost went broke with only his enlisted man's pay coming in. Most of the cast stayed in tents in Santa Monica during the filming of the picture. A six-month tour of the country followed. The show was then broken up and many of the cast went overseas to entertain units or in other activities.

Grid Pool Men Nabbed
ALBANY, Ore. (AP)—Police arrested two men Monday in what they said was an attempt to end operation of football pool gambling in this area.
Alan Ragsdale, city policeman, said he placed a \$5 bet on a pool ticket, and then arrested Albert "Sandy" Senders, 53, member of a prominent Albany family, and Raymond Schrock, 38, proprietor of a tavern.
A warrant was issued for the arrest of Art Erskine, Portland, Dist. Atty. Courtney Johns said the pool was part of a nationwide syndicate, and that Erskine would be accused of being the agent who sent tickets to Senders. Senders was accused of being the local distributing agent.
Johns said a \$1,000 check made out to Erskine and signed by Schrock was found in Senders' possession.

Stubborn Hippo Now Has Baby
COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—Snookie, one of the world's most contrary hippopotamuses, is a mother. And it looks as though her 75-pound, day-old baby is going to be just as stubborn as the old gal.
The little one, who will be named after Joe E. Brown or Martha Raye as soon as its sex is determined, is "all mouth and head," says Columbus Zoo Supt. Earl P. Davis.
Snookie gained national fame in 1949 when she staged a sitdown strike at Chicago's Brookfield Zoo. Attendants tried to load all 4,000 pounds of her into a truck for transfer to Columbus. They succeeded after eight days by crowding her out of her cage with tons of hay.
