Russell Duke Held for US Cleveland

CLEVELAND (AP)—A former Francisco public relations wanted on a contempt of charge for failing to appear before a Senate committee, held in county jail Friday.

Russell W. Duke, 40, formerly of Portland, who protested that arrest was "political," was held up Thursday at an auto sales agency where he had been working. United States Commissioner H. A. Horn ordered Duke held under \$3,000 bond.

A Senate charge was placed on Duke a month after Duke refused to appear at a hearing in Washington before Sen. Joseph McCarthy's investigating committee.

Excess Weight Saves Woman's Life

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Her excess weight may have helped save the life of a 45-year-old woman who fell 13 stories from a hotel window, Jefferson Hospital physicians say.

That, plus the fact that a skylight broke her fall and she landed in a sitting position.

Staff doctors said Mrs. Betty Green Kaskin's plumpness cushioned the shock. And while in a sitting position, they explained, the body is best able to diffuse shock.

The woman, who is reported recovering from the fall Nov. 13, suffered a number of cracked vertebrae, broken ribs, a torn kidney and compound fractures of the right leg.

Pacific Fruit Strikebound

PORTLAND (AP)—The second strike in a week halted deliveries from the big Pacific Fruit and Produce plant here Friday.

AFL teamsters posted a picket line and AFL warehousemen refused to pass it.

A teamsters' spokesman, Clyde Crosby, said the dispute involves wages, hours and working conditions. A brief strike of teamsters and warehousemen at the plant one week ago was the result of the discharge of an employee.

Friday's strike halted some 25 grocery and produce trucks which were to have made deliveries to about 1,200 Western Oregon and Southwestern Washington merchants.

Crosby said the teamsters' local had negotiated with the firm since Aug. 1 without reaching an agreement.

Old Pumper To Be Returned

BALTIMORE (AP)—The chances of Alexandria, Va., getting back the old fire pumper George Washington once presented to one of its fire companies appeared assured today.

The Baltimore Fire Board agreed to lend the squat, 189-year-old engine to Alexandria officials for as long as they keep it on display in Friendship Firehouse, soon to be dedicated as a national shrine.

The loan is still to be approved by the Baltimore Board of Estimates.

Baltimore acquired the engine from a Frederick junk dealer in 1849 and it has been on display in the Washington Monument here.

It, Snookie, wouldn't allow caretakers close enough to determine sex, was Snookie's third baby. One drowned. Mama—all 4,000 pounds of her—sat on the other.

Snookie became famous a few years ago with an eight-day sit-down strike while being transferred from Chicago to Columbus Zoo.
