Missing Car Said Found

District Attorney Frank Alderson said Monday that an automobile supposed to have been stolen by Lorenzo W. Secor, Klamath Falls, Mich. World War I veteran, has been found stored in a Roseburg garage.

Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg last week set aside a plea of guilty by Secor to an automobile theft charge. Under questioning by the court, Secor declared that the car had been loaned to him by Erwin H. Edwards. Alderson said Edwards admitted giving Secor Secor permission to take the automobile.

The defendant told the court that he parked the car in the Klamath Falls business district and subsequently became intoxicated. He said he never saw the car again.

According to Alderson the automobile was impounded by Roseburg police after it had been abandoned there.

In commenting on his action in setting aside the guilty plea, Judge Vandenberg declared the defendant could not be guilty of larceny of an automobile. He advised Secor to hire a lawyer. The case will come before the court again Wednesday. Secor is held in the county jail.

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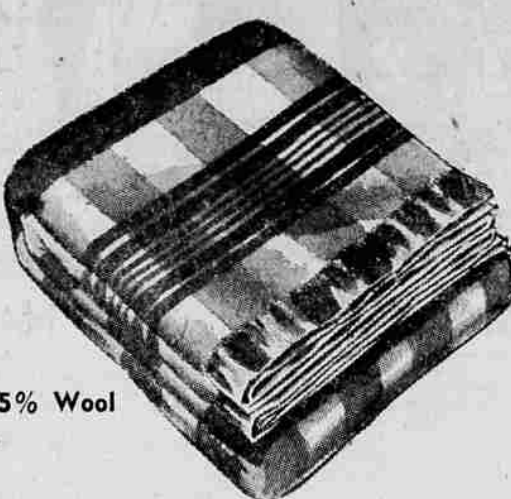
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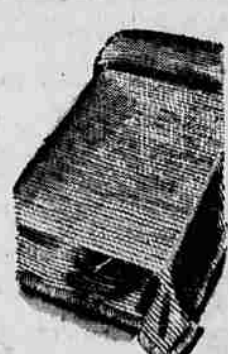
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
