

Red Manner Draws Rap From Lodge

Air Officer Cleared

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The United States said Tuesday the only way Russia can win American friendship is to "give up seeking the violent overthrow of the United States."

Chief U.S. Delegate Henry Cabot Lodge Jr. told the U.N. 60-nation Political Committee the Soviet Union "admits it is plotting our destruction." He said this naturally caused a strong reaction among the American people and press.

Lodge departed from the prepared text of a speech in which he urged the U.N. to junk each and every part of Russia's 1953-mideal peace plan to make his tough charges against the Soviet Union.

He said the reason the Russians are viewed with "something less than affection" in the United States is because of their self-admitted campaign to overthrow the American government and way of life.

Another reason, Lodge said, is Communist persecution of religion as exemplified in the recent arrest of Poland's Stefan Cardinal aroused religious people throughout the world.

The American delegate added, however, that the United States is "not discouraged. We still hope. We believe the day will come when this campaign from behind the Iron Curtain will cease. But, until it does, we can only recognize the facts."

After the Russian peace proposals, Lodge said "the resolutions now on the books deal adequately with the subject. The only thing we still require is for the Soviet Union to quit disregarding them."

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of the Air Force Talbot Tuesday ruled that Lt. Milo J. Radulovich "is not a security risk" and reversed a 10th Air Force board recommendation that the reserve officer be discharged.

Radulovich, now attending the University of Michigan under the G.I. program, had been slated for discharge following a hearing which the charge was made that he was

a poor risk because of alleged Communist sympathies of his father and sister.

Radulovich's attorney, Charles C. Lockwood, said his client was accused because his sister had taken part in picket line activities and his father had read a "radical" newspaper.

Talbot, reversing the recommendation of the board at Selfridge Field, Mich., said Radulovich had served honorably and well for 14 months as an airman and six years as an officer on active duty.

He said the lieutenant's "association with his sister is not such as to make her activities and beliefs the determining factor in this case."

Rain Maker "Shows How"

CARSON CITY, Nev. (AP) — The skies were blue and the temperature was mild, but it snowed in Gov. Charles Russell's office Monday.

However, the "storm" was confined to a small, steel box operated by a would-be weather maker from Denver.

Boyd E. Quate of the Water Resources Development Corp. produced the tiny snowstorm with steam and chemicals to show the governor and other state officials how the firm creates artificial rainfall.

Quate estimated the cost of producing rain would range from three to five cents an acre. He said his firm increased rainfall in areas of southern Utah and Texas by 30 to 60 per cent.

Nevada, with more than half the state in the throes of a severe drought, is interested in rain, snow or any other form of moisture no matter how it is made.

But the governor pointed out the state has no money for creating rain artificially.

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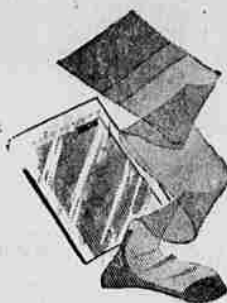
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
