Deer Lifted Out Of Waterway

LOCKPORT, Ill. (AP)—When Robert Schwartz, 29, and Edward Hall, 45, on their way to work, spotted a deer swimming in the 60-foot-wide Illinois Waterway, they jumped into a rowboat and lassoed the animal.

They towed it to the docks of the Material Service Corp., where both men, borrowed an auto wreck truck and with its derrick lifted the 150-pound buck from the water.

A game warden took over later and said he probably would turn the deer loose in a state park. There is no legal hunting season for deer in Illinois.

Produce Market In Holiday Swing

PORTLAND (AP)—You could tell from the trading on the East Side produce market Tuesday that the Thanksgiving holiday is close. Demand exceeded supply at some points for cranberries, yams and sweet potatoes.

Large Oregon cranberries sold from \$6.50 to \$6.75 wholesale for 4 pounds in one-pound bags. There weren't many eastern berries on the market and these went at steep prices.

Sweet potatoes, from California, sold to a top of \$6.75 with most good ones priced generally a dollar less a hamper. Texas yams whole sold at \$4.60 to \$4.75 and Louisiana yams were \$5 to \$5.25.

Oregon farmers didn't offer much for the early morning market and everything had a listless tone.

Maryland To Go To Orange Bowl

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)—The University of Maryland, the nation's top ranking football power, was selected Tuesday to meet Oklahoma in Miami's Orange Bowl Jan. 1.

Announcement that Maryland would represent the Atlantic Coast conference was made by Dr. J. T. Penney of the University of South Carolina, conference president.

Dr. Penney said Maryland's selection had been unanimous in the vote of faculty representatives of the conference's seven colleges.

Aussie Troops Run Wild Nabbing Atom "Souvenirs"

CANBERRA, Australia (AP)—A high government source said Tuesday that "souvenirizing run wild" resulted in the lifting by Australian

troops of secret British atomic gear from the Woomera rocket range in South Australia.

The informant said that British

scientists at the site, where Britain recently set off atomic explosions, apparently had told the Australian soldiers they could have certain gear not worth the expense of returning to Britain. This included generators and radio

equipment.

The troops interpreted liberally the permission given them, taking some secret electronic gear, the informant said, adding:

"You know what Australian troops are. They made the most of the situation."

"Britain did not tell Australia that the equipment had been abandoned at Woomera. The first we knew was when huge quantities of

parcels began to swamp the Woomera rocket range post office.

"We believe all the missing equipment has been located now, but the government has not decided what action to take against the soldiers, who are all sticking to

their story that they had permission to take the equipment."

US Aid Can Be Cut Safely

WASHINGTON (AP)—Two prominent Republicans, both having first-hand knowledge of European affairs, say United States financial aid to foreign nations can and should be reduced.

Their reason: Western Europe has recovered sufficiently, with the

help of the United States, to maintain substantially its current defense budgets.

The two, House Speaker Joseph Martin of Massachusetts and Director Harold E. Stassen, of the Foreign Operations Administration (FOA), said they believe U. S. economic aid can be terminated except in a few cases.

Martin expressed his views at a news conference Monday upon his return from a two-month tour of Europe. He said his trip led him to believe "we are going to have peace."

Stassen's opinion was contained in a letter to Rep. Bentley (R-Mich.), who made public part of its contents. It has been known for some time that Stassen inclines toward less foreign economic aid because of the free world's improved fiscal health.

Mundt Will Speak Here

Senator Karl Mundt of South Dakota will address the Klamath Falls Knife and Fork Club on Thursday evening, December 3, W. W. Southwell, secretary of the organization, announced Tuesday.

Senator Mundt has a national reputation as an after dinner speaker. He was recently featured on the Town Meeting of the Air and the Chicago University Round Table. He was acting chairman of the House Committee investigating Un-American activities during the hearings resulting in the discovery of the "pumpkin papers" and the conviction of Alger Hiss.

Senator Mundt will speak on "The American of the Future" at the dinner in the Willard Hotel.

Barge Pulled Off Clatsop Spit

ASTORIA (AP)—A 260-foot barge, loaded with 16,000 barrels of benzol, was pulled off Clatsop Spit at the mouth of the Columbia River Monday.

The barge drifted there after breaking loose from the tug Sea Lion late Sunday night.

The tug Salvage Chief pulled the barge free.

Sub Story Gets Backing Up

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Defense Department spokesman says Secretary Wilson didn't mean it literally when he said that, after World War II, "we were dumb enough to turn over the whole German submarine fleet to the Russians."

The spokesman said Monday, in commenting on a story in The Washington Star, that Wilson meant giving some submarines to Russia supplied the Reds with technical data vital to building their present formidable fleet.

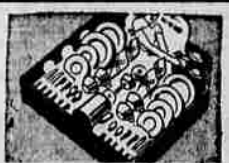

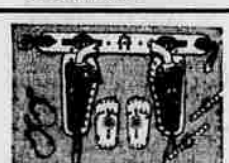

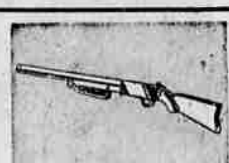
