One of Oldest Merrill Buildings to be Razed

MERRILL—One of Merrill's oldest buildings and landmark in Merrill, which the town is razed, took marks will soon disappear from the local scene. Workers have started tearing down the two-story frame building on the corner of Main and Front streets, known in the past few years as the old Safeway building. Old timers however, will remember it as the Carlock building, for its original owner and builder was Robert Carlock, the school principal, now living in Portland.

The building was constructed in 1907 to serve as a general meeting place for residents of the community, and until it was moved to its present location in 1915, stood where the Merrill Community Hall is now located.

Lodge meetings were held upstairs, dances, parties, and later movies, downstairs. N. S. Merrill, for whom the town is named, took over when Carlock ran into financial difficulties. He and Mrs. Merrill purchased most of the furnishings for the hall, including silverware service for 70, and the carpeting for the upstairs, which is still there.

The building has been re-modeled and re-painted, and has housed such varied enterprises as a millinery shop and a pool hall. There were rooms on the north side and the owner's apartment was in the rear.

R. H. Anderson, Klamath County pioneer who passed away several years ago, moved his stock of general merchandise to the building in 1921, when his own store building on Front Street burned to the ground.

A small addition was added to the north corner after the building was moved, and its first occupants were two ladies with unpronounceable names, who dealt in millinery. They were followed by George O'Field, who operated the town butcher shop, and later by Murphy's Butcher Shop.

Ray Merrill, another pioneer, and a gentleman named Wright, purchased the building about 1923 for a pool hall. Bob Dalton was the next occupant, and the building reverted back to a grocery store, with hardware as a side-line.

In 1945 a Safeway store was installed, remaining till 1949. Since that time the building has been used for an occasional rummage sale downstairs, and the VFW and

USBR Reshift Plan Okayed

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of the Interior McKay Wednesday announced approval of a reorganization plan for region 7 of the Reclamation Bureau under which regional headquarters will be retained in Denver.

Existing district offices at McCook, Neb., Denver and Casper, Wyo., will be abolished as part of a consolidated project which will be maintained at McCook. McKay said necessary personnel will be retained in Casper to maintain essential construction, operation and maintenance tasks in that area.

The region includes the section of the Missouri River lying principally in southeastern Wyoming, Eastern Colorado, Nebraska and Kansas and the Snake River drainage area in Idaho, Utah and northern Arizona, Kan. It includes projects for importation of water from those basins.
