US Readers Fall Short

ZURICH, Switzerland, (AP)—A poll of American newspaper readers shows that 40 per cent of them are unable to identify Georgi Malenkov as Soviet Russia's Premier, the International Press Institute disclosed last night.

The average American, said IPI reads "very little" of the 4 1/2 columns of foreign news printed daily by the average American newspapers. "The level of his knowledge is low," the institute commented.

The summary was contained in a 266-page book called "The Flow of News," published by the IPI. An organization of editors in 32 countries, its study was financed by the Ford and Rockefeller foundations.

The reader poll was conducted for IPI last April and May by the American Institute for Public Opinion. Malenkov succeeded Joseph Stalin as Russian Premier March 6.

The survey found 79 per cent of the Americans interviewed didn't know NATO means the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

Segregation Row Rises In Kansas

WASHINGTON (AP)—Kansas and South Carolina contended to the Supreme Court Monday that the federal courts lack power to outlaw racial segregation in the public schools.

Both states filed briefs preliminary to oral argument before the high tribunal next week of a series of cases attacking segregation of Negro and white pupils. Pending before the court are cases from Virginia, Delaware, Kansas, South Carolina and the District of Columbia.

The cases attack segregation on the grounds that it violates the 14th Amendment.

South Carolina and Kansas argued on the other hand that the 14th Amendment was not intended to end segregation.

The Kansas brief said it was the intent of the framers of the 14th Amendment that the management of public schools should be left to the state legislatures.

The federal judiciary may not now assume jurisdiction over this phase of state activities in disregard of the framers' intent," the brief said.

"The people of Kansas, through the normal processes of local government, are demonstrating their willingness and capacity to deal with local race problems in a manner most beneficial to all concerned.

"Federal interference is neither necessary nor justified."

The Kansas brief defended sep-

the validity of a state law which permits local school boards to provide for racial segregation through junior high schools and, in the case of Kansas City, Kan., through high school.

The brief noted that counsel for the state of Kansas have never advocated or defended the use of racial segregation in the schools or elsewhere.

"We advocate only a constitutional law that would determine of state and local policy to be made on state and local levels," the brief said.
