Army Changes Enlist Rule

Men who have served in any branch of the armed forces may now enlist for specific assignments of their choice at military installations in the eight western states if they qualify, it was announced by Sgt. Long, station commander of the U.S. Army and U.S. Air Force recruiting service in the Klamath Falls area.

To utilize trained men in specialized jobs, the sixth army recruiting service is giving experienced ex-servicemen an opportunity for assignment in the work and location they prefer. A roster of all vacancies in the eight western states which comprise the sixth army area — Washington, Oregon, California, Arizona, Montana, Idaho, Utah and Nevada — is published monthly. These lists are available at the local recruiting station, room 309, Post Office building, Klamath Falls, Oregon, for information and guidance of all ex-servicemen.

Men who have been out of the army less than 90 days will be reenlisted at the same rating as they held upon discharge; less than one year, they will be reenlisted only one grade lower than that at time of discharge.

Not Guilty Plea Entered In Court

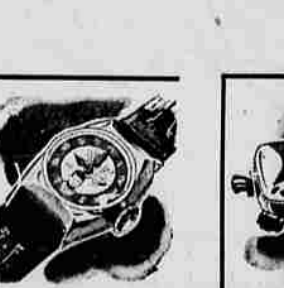

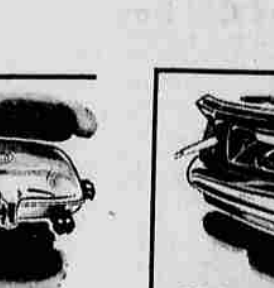
