Copco Power Hits Lines

ROSEBURG (AP)—California Electric Power Company's Clearwater plant No. 2 is now in operation and supplying power to Roseburg transmission lines, Copco General Manager John Boyle reports.

The plant is high in the Cascades on the North Umpqua River about 10 miles east of Roseburg. It is part of a power development carried on by Copco on the river for many years.

Opening of the plant adds 26,000 kilowatts to the system. At full output, the new plant is capable of producing 30,000 kilowatts. Copco's North Umpqua project plants two more dams are under construction to produce about 160,000 kilowatts.

Goodwill Group Plan Tightened

A closer-knit Goodwill program during the holiday season will be worked out this year, it developed at a meeting Wednesday during a luncheon of the Inter-Agency Council in the YMCA.

Representatives from most of the organizations in the city, the schools, churches, welfare groups and others present, voiced the need for a central clearing ground where names and needs may be presented to prevent duplication of efforts in seeing that all who need remembering are found.

Particular stress is to be laid on the teen-agers and the aged. Following establishment of a center, volunteers will be needed to man the phone, wrap packages and prepare them for delivery.

A panel of three, Lt. Dallas Madison, of the Salvation Army, Mrs. Altha Urquhart, head of the welfare agency and the Rev. D. W. Proett of Peace Memorial Presbyterian church brought out ideas of personal contacts.

Lt. Madison, spoke of the need of visiting every home, taking a spiritual interest, which the Army does each year. A "Golden Age" dinner is also served on Christmas Day for the aged and this same

program will again be carried out this year while assistance is also being given to the plan proposed by the Inter-Agency Council.

Mrs. Urquhart suggested taking Christmas cards to the Klamath Nursing Home to be addressed by the giver during the visit to someone, the elderly people know. The trip should be made early enough to permit a return greeting to the sender. Homemade candy and fruit cake would be welcomed.

Mrs. Urquhart especially commended the Elks Lodge for the generous annual contribution for providing Christmas food and gifts through the agency she heads. She said too, that the welfare society attempts to make Christmas as nearly normal as possible for families, and particularly for teen-agers.

Rev. Proett warned against intrusion in giving, and believed that help should extend far beyond the Christmas season. He mentioned the drain upon resources of agencies here during the potato harvest when hundreds of workers arrive without housing accommodations or food.

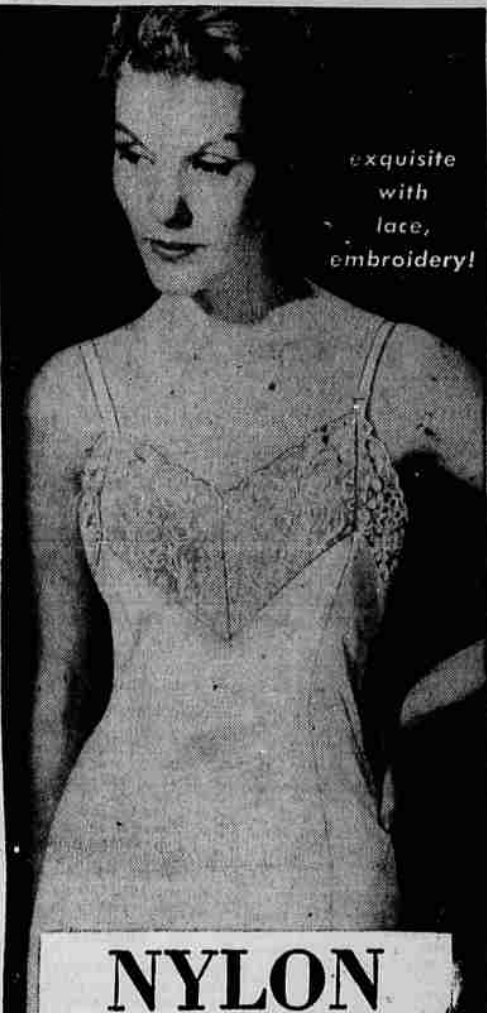
