"Fall Guy" Tale Told

Two juveniles who were reported to have made a "fall guy" out of a 37-year-old laborer by wrongly accusing him of selling them a fifth of whisky were being questioned Tuesday.

The defendant, Ray Birch, was arrested Monday and lodged in the County Jail. Later he was arraigned before District Judge D. E. Van Vactor, he pleaded not guilty. Bail was set at \$500 and a trial scheduled for Thursday.

The two boys who named Birch as the liquor vendor told County Juvenile Officer Francis Mathews Tuesday morning that they had the defendant arrested to give the man who really sold them the liquor time to "get out of town."

Mathews said he had referred the case to District Attorney Frank Alderson. It is expected the charge against Birch will be dismissed.

Hallinan Gets Jail Sentence

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Vincent Hallinan, wealthy San Francisco attorney, was sentenced Tuesday to 18 months in prison and was fined \$50,000 for federal income tax evasion.

Hallinan was convicted Nov. 14 of five counts of a seven-count indictment. He was found guilty of evading \$30,739 in federal taxes for the years 1947 through 1950.

Federal Judge Edward P. Murphy gave him the maximum fine of \$50,000 on each count. He could have sentenced Hallinan to a total of 25 years in prison.

The lawyer was sentenced to 18 months in prison on each of the five counts, but the terms will run concurrently.

The judge ordered Hallinan to pay the cost of the trial, which ran through 11 weeks. This would include jurors' fees, cost of services and all other court expenses. Judge Murphy stipulated that Hallinan must stay in prison until the full amount of the fine is paid.

Hallinan, who was the Independent Progressive Party's candidate for President in 1952 repeated his earlier statement that he felt he had a fair trial.

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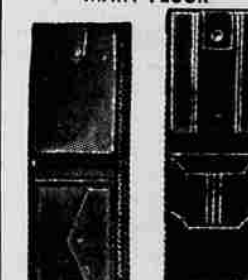
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
