4 Killed by Tornado

DUNSMUIR — A crash into the rear of an empty car for passenger cars took the life early Wednesday morning, Dec. 9, of Earl Hamilton of Ashland.

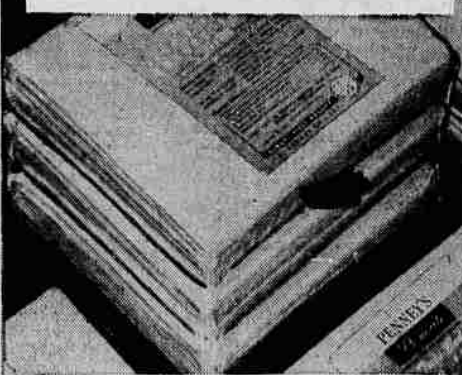
