The 13,344-ton ship, whose rudder broke Wednesday, rode out a week-end gale and rough seas and was reported still plugging along on her own power, steering only by her twin screw propellers.

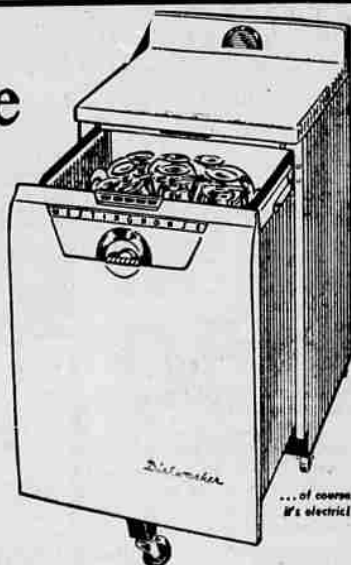
