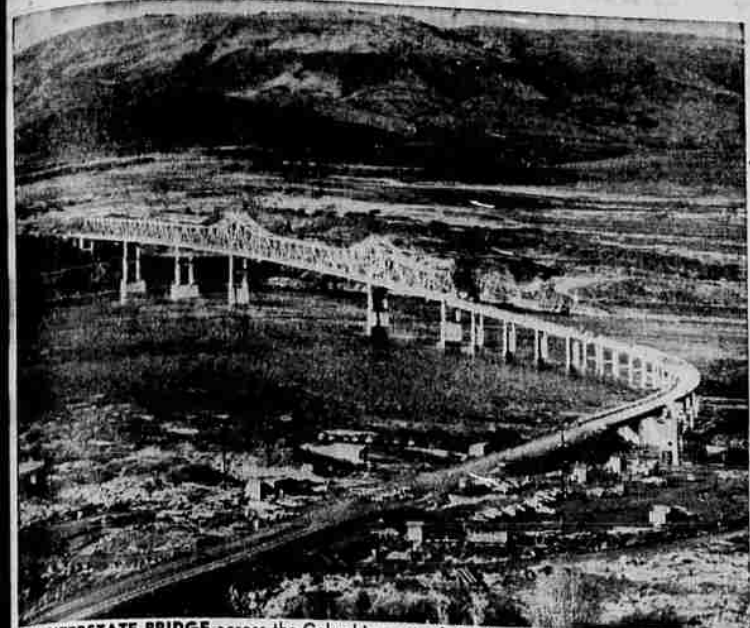




NEW INTERSTATE BRIDGE across the Columbia east of Portland is capable of carrying all loads and will be open to the public December 18. Governors Paul L. Patterson of Oregon and Arthur B. Langlie of Washington will participate in joint ceremonies dedicating the bridge and celebrating first pour of concrete at The Dalles dam. The Dalles interstate bridge, located about two miles east of The Dalles, is a direct link between Washington's Evergreen Highway and Oregon's The Dalles-California highway and the watergrade Columbia highway. The bridge will serve to make this the shortest route between Seattle and California. It was built by Wasco County, Oregon, with work being done by Atkinson-Ostrander Contractors. The steel structure of the bridge, over water, is 3340 feet. Length of bridge approaches are 2.9 miles. Dedication ceremonies will be held Friday, December 18, beginning at 11:00 a.m.

Two Headed Baby Okay

INDIANAPOLIS (AP)—A two-headed, four-armed baby has been given two names and doctors report it is making the progress of a normal newborn. The 3-day-old boy was taken off "critical" list yesterday and his chances of survival were reported as good. Doctors at the Indiana University Medical Center said he is taking nourishment in his mouth and the intestinal tract is responding normally. The 44-year-old father said he gave the name Donald Ray to "the first one" and the name Daniel to the other head and arms. There was no explanation to the parents to "the best one." There are two spinal cords.

Dean Still Hopeful On Korea Talks

TOKYO (AP)—U. S. envoy Arthur H. Dean headed for Washington today, hopeful that a Korean peace conference will be called despite seven weeks of no progress preliminary negotiations. As he boarded a Pan American airliner for a nonstop flight to Honolulu, Dean told newsmen it is "distinctly possible" that talks to set up a peace conference will be resumed although it might take some time. Dean, spokesman for 17 Allied nations which fought in Korea, broke off the talks Saturday and demanded that the Communists apologize for accusing the United States of conniving with South Korea to release 27,000 anti-Red pris-

oners last June. The Reds have not apologized and today Peiping radio repeated the charge and accused Dean of wrecking plans for a peace conference. Moscow radio also declared that suspension of the preliminary negotiations was part of "the long-term maneuvering of the United States for wrecking the armistice in Korea." Dean will make a full report to the State Department on his return to Washington, where he is due tomorrow. The U. S. envoy's chief adviser, Kenneth Young, returns to Korea tomorrow to await possible Communist retraction of the perfidy

charge against the United States. Although the outlook for a Korean peace conference was doubtful, South Korea's President Syngman Rhee told a news conference in Seoul that he would give the conference 90 days to make progress toward unification of his country. Rhee stressed, however, that he would wait only a "certain time" for the conference to get underway. In the past Rhee and other South Korean government leaders have threatened to drive northward against the Communists unless the war-torn peninsula were unified by late January—80 days after the conference was scheduled to open

under terms of the armistice. Allied diplomats here viewed Rhee's statement as a major policy shift which goes a long way toward easing the danger of a new outbreak of warfare in Korea.

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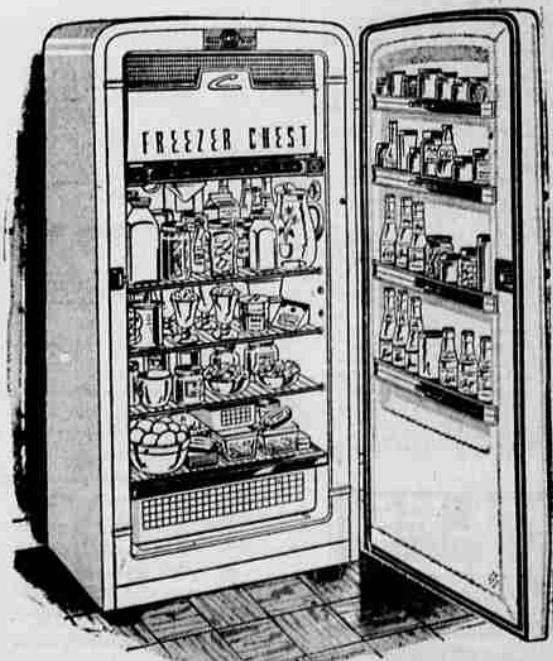
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CAMERA CHATTER

"Snapshots in the snow"



When the snow is on the ground and the sun is low in the sky, it is time to take your most effective winter snapshots and snow scenes.

There are, of course, numerous "pet" methods endorsed by various camera enthusiasts for taking good snow pictures. For the beginner, however, there are only two important things to remember. Your snow pictures will be effective and memorable if they capture the TEXTURE of the snow and the LONG SHAD-OWS so typical of winter scenery.

To get an effective SHAD-OW effect when you snap a picture, look at your own shadow. It should be long and at right angles to the direction in which your camera is aimed. If that condition exists, you can count on the subject matter of your picture (whether it be trees or a young deer) to cast similar long shadows that your camera will pick up.

To capture the TEXTURE of the snow, try using a yellow filter. The filter will emphasize the texture of the snow and darken the sky tones for the sparkling kind of contrast that makes a good snapshot outstanding! To get an almost black sky which will set off the white snow and render even more effective texture than with the yellow filter, use a red filter, either A or F. Keep

In mind, though, that the red filter must be used with either Plus X or super XX type of film.

To sum up snow snapshots:
1. To get shadows, shoot while the sun is low.
2. To get the texture, combine your shadows with use of a filter.
