Two prominent Klamath Falls businessmen were injured about 9 p.m. Tuesday when a pickup in which they were riding went out of control and rolled down an embankment north of here.

Jerry Short, potato grower, who resides at Cove Point and operates the Wocus Tavern, and Don Kirkpatrick, who recently purchased the East Side Appliance, were going north on Highway 97 when the mishap occurred about one mile north of the North Entrance Motel.

The injured were brought to the Klamath Valley Hospital by Klamath Ambulance Service. Attending physicians stated this morning that neither man was seriously hurt. Kirkpatrick is reported to have two broken ribs, a cracked breast bone and a bone chipped in the right shoulder, while Short was treated for a head laceration and a wrenched neck. Both men were reported to be resting easily.
