Prosperity To Continue into 1954

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower will forecast continued prosperity in 1954 when he sends his annual economic message to Congress in January, his aides say. But they also expect him to outline the defense his administration plans to throw up against any possible recession. The President's Council of Economic Advisors has been working on a stabilization program since last spring. It calls for four main anti-depression steps, ranging from federal action to encourage maintenance of high production and employment to a federal public works program that would be called into play only in a dire economic emergency. If the public works project are needed, officials say, only those that would contribute to the country's long-range productivity and economic growth would be built. The phases in the anti-depression program: 1. Strengthening of some of the "built-in stabilizers" against deflation: Social security extension, unemployment compensation coverage, increase in the minimum wage from 75 cents an hour, more immediate action in anticipating price supports also might come under this heading. If Eisenhower and Secretary of Agriculture Benson adopt that policy. 2. Measures to give consumers and business firms spending incentives: Lowering of interest rates, encouraging business investment by federal reserve and treasury moves affecting bank reserves and national debt management. 3. Tax adjustment: An overhaul of the federal tax structure already underway with stress on removing obstacles to business investment and consumer purchasing. Administration officials made it plain that balancing would have to be kept aside if it looks as though a reduction and deficit spending would be needed to prevent economic collapse. 4. Public works: Private industry as well as state and local governments would get federal loans, tax concessions and other indirect aid in financing needed projects to avoid direct federal spending wherever possible.

Long-Time Editor Dies

SPOKANE (AP) — Funeral services were scheduled here Monday for Malcolm C. Glendinning, retired managing editor of the Spokesman-Review. Glendinning, 78, died Saturday after a lengthy illness. A newspaperman for nearly half a century, Glendinning went to work on the Spokesman-Review as a reporter in 1902. In 1909, he became publisher of the Wallace, Idaho, Press but returned to the Spokesman-Review the following year and remaining there until his retirement in 1950. He was city editor from 1910 to 1938 and news editor until 1942 when he was appointed managing editor. Survivors include his widow, Verla; two daughters, Mrs. Thomas Price, Spokane, and Mrs. Richard C. Paulson, Seattle, and a son, Robert D. Glendinning, Vancouver, Wash.

Red Voters Need Call

VIENNA, Austria (AP) — Radio Vienna said Monday 99.8 per cent of Austria's voters cast ballots for Communist-run fatherland front candidates in Sunday's parliamentary elections. They were the only candidates on the ballot. The radio said 4,964,544 persons, or 93.5 per cent of the eligible voters, went to the polls to elect a new 465-man assembly to replace the one in which there already was no opposition to the Red regime. Of these, 4,954,765 voted for the Red candidates. Eligible voters who failed to show up at the polls were liable for fines of 500 leva (about \$7.50) and other penalties. Among those re-elected to the assembly was Premier Vulko Chervenkov.
