Dragnet Fans Get Lowdown On Tough Guy - - As Cupid

HOLLYWOOD (AP) - This may come as a surprise to Dragnet fans, but Joe Friday's sidekick made his movie debut as Cupid in 1916.

This is one of the facts, ma'am, I uncovered in an hour's grilling of Sgt. Frank Smith, known to his friends and movie fans with memories as Ben Alexander. Ben, the rotund, easy-going partner in crime detecting with Jack Webb, is a reluctant actor at this point in his career. After all, look how long ago he started.

"I was born in Goldfield, Nev., where my father had gone on a mining venture," Ben recounted. "From there we went to Hanford, Calif., where we lived in a hotel. My mother heard they were making movies in Hollywood, so she wrote some studios about job possibilities. They said there was plenty of work, so she and I packed up and came down here.

"We lived on the corner of Hollywood and Vine and the studio was just a block away. I had my first business venture there, selling lemonade in front of an orange grove across the street.

"My first picture was a dilly called 'Each Pearl a Tear.' It starred Fanny Ward and Lou Tellegen and I played Cupid. They gave me a ribbon for a costume and strung me on a wire. Every time the stars looked at each other, I flew in and shot them with an arrow."
