Christmas Day — service, 10 a.m. in the Merrill Presbyterian Church.

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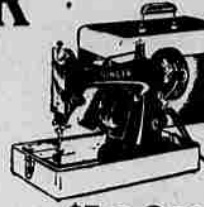
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Candlelight Service Set
