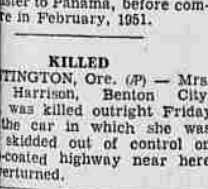

Another alleged participant in the attack is sought by city police. The man held was arrested by city detectives. He was booked as Ellis P. Sawyer.

According to District Attorney Frank Alderson, Mrs. Fern Naessens, the complainant, says the two men took her away from a downtown tavern and kept her imprisoned for two hours in an automobile. During the time they held her, she claims both men assaulted her. She was badly beaten.

After she was released by her assailants, Mrs. Naessens went to police headquarters and filed a complaint.

CHICAGO (AP)—Trading in livestock during the past week was featured by a sharp advance in hogs, which went to the best prices in December since 1947.

Gains ranged from 75 cents to \$1.25 for the week. At the close \$27,000 was paid for a short load. Reduced receipts, broad shipping demand and higher wholesale port prices were in back of the advance.

In the cattle section fed steers and heifers closed the week unevenly 50 cents to \$1.50 higher. Cows were steady to 25 cents higher, bulls strong to \$1.00 up and vealers steady to \$1.00 ahead.

Suspect Held In Fatal Shooting

State and city police last night picked up a 39-year-old Negro farm worker as a suspect in the fatal shooting of Cruz Unzueta on Klamath Avenue early Thursday morning.

Unzueta died at the Klamath Valley Hospital about 4 a.m. Christmas Day from a bullet wound in the abdomen. He was unable to give police any assistance regarding his assailant.

Alfred Junior Carter, Rt. 2, Box 538A, is being held in the city jail pending further investigation. He has admitted owning a gun found in his car which is believed to be the gun used in the fatal shooting, but has stated to city police that he had nothing to do with the killing.

It is reported several witnesses identified Carter as the man they saw leave the scene of the shooting in a car, driving away at a high rate of speed without lights. Carter is said to have worked on several farms in the Henley district coming here more than a year ago.

Bird Count To Be Made

Sunday, Dec. 27, the Nature Society will conduct the seventh annual Christmas bird count of the Klamath Basin.

Parties will cover the Klamath Basin area, Crater Lake National Park, Upper and Lower Klamath Lakes, the bird refuges, Modoc Lava Beds, Sprague River and Bly country.

Counters will assemble at the Kenneth McLeod home, 413 High at 5:30 Sunday evening to compile the results of the day's count. Results of the county become part of the national compilation of the Audubon Society, which has taken a Christmas bird count for 53 years.

The compilation will be published in "Audubon Nature Notes," in the Christmas Bird edition.
