Vows Exchanged In Grants Pass

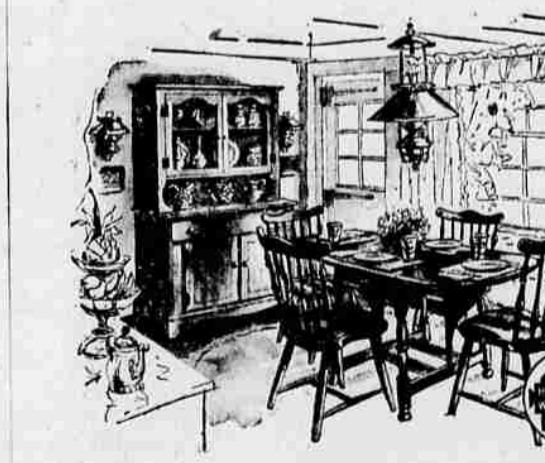
