### Tax Paying More Of Job Than Ever

WASHINGTON (AP) — If you have to file estimated income tax reports, you have a double deadline coming up at midnight Friday.

But you must:  
1. Make a correction if your previous estimates have been off by 20 per cent or more.  
2. Pay the final installment on your estimated tax for 1953.

Here are the categories of taxpayers who are required to file estimated income tax returns:

1. Persons with wages or salary not subject to withholding.  
2. Persons with more than \$100 in other kinds of income from which federal income tax was not withheld.

This would include income from rent, untaxed side earnings apart from your regular work and profits on sale of property. Only half the profit on property sale, including securities, is taxable if the property is held more than six months before being sold.

3. Persons whose wages or salary subject to withholding were more than \$4,500 after deduction of \$600 for each exemption. That would mean a total income of \$6,900 for a family man, wife and two children and no other exemptions.

4. Farmers, whose income would usually fit the above description, need not file estimated income tax returns if they file the regular return and pay any tax due by Jan. 31.

You file your estimated tax return on a special form—1040es. You can get it from your district director of internal revenue or from your local Post Office or bank.

### Pilot Tells Tale Of Long Wait For Rescue; Week Of No Sleep, Little Food

POINT BARROW, Alaska (AP) — A pilot who made a forced landing on the arctic ice pack told here Tuesday night how he survived for a week without sleep at 50 below zero temperatures before he was sighted by Air Force fliers searching in winter's almost endless darkness.

Juel Thebeudeau vanished Jan. 5 while flying from Fairbanks to the community of Point Barrow where his wife was expected to give birth to twins. He was sighted Monday just as the organized search was about to be abandoned. This, Thebeudeau said, is what happened to him:

He was forced down north of the mouth of the Colville River on pack ice when the engine of his light plane quit because of the intense cold. Marooned, he had only a small amount of food and no radio with which to summon aid.

He sat in the cabin of his light plane for five days, not daring to go to sleep because he was afraid he would freeze to death. During this period he heard the drone of a search plane in the darkness overhead. He threw his remaining gasoline, his gloves and the seats

of the aircraft on the ice and set them afire. But the search plane drifted away, unseeing.

On the fifth day, Thebeudeau ate his last food and set out for aid. He was 100 miles from Barrow but said he knew of cabins 50 miles away.

"I had no gloves for my hands and the thermometer on the plane registered 40 below zero."

He cut holes in his parka and through his shirt so he could warm his gloveless hands against his body as he staggered over the pack ice. He was hungry but had no gun to shoot the arctic fox he saw digging smelt out of cracks in the ice. He dared not take his hands from his body to dig out any of the fish for himself.

Monday morning, the now exhausted pilot heard a search aircraft one-half mile to the south of his position. He desperately tried to signal the plane by setting fire to his maps and compass, which were the last burnable items he possessed. But the search plane passed on without sighting him.

About four hours later, the drone of another search plane was heard and Thebeudeau spread out his sleeping bag on the snow. He ran back and forth near it. This time the plane passed directly over him and the crew sighted him in the gloom.

The search pilot was unable to land on the jagged ice, but the pilot summoned a smaller Wien Alaska Airlines plane from Barrow. The light plane landed in total darkness, skidding to a stop only 20 feet from a huge pressure ridge.

Thebeudeau was hospitalized right alongside his wife who had given birth to the twins, a boy and a girl, while her husband was lost. He will be hospitalized for a few days, nursing frozen fingers, toes, cheeks and ears. The frostbite is not considered serious.

### International Note Told In Sunland Police Record

LOS ANGELES (AP) — International note from the police blotter in suburban Sunland: A reindeer herder from Lapland, hitchhiking, reported he was conked on the head with a vodka

bottle by four Spanish-speaking men who had picked him up. They robbed him of \$6 and threw him out of the car.

Arnold Blomberg, 28, told officers Tuesday he is from Ivale, Lapland—in Northern Finland—where there are lots of reindeer, and had just arrived in the United States from Australia, where there are no reindeer.

But Blomberg had heard there are plenty of reindeer in the Yellow Knife country of Canada—that's in the Mackenzie Territory—and they might need a good journeyman reindeer herder there. His visa won't let him work in this

### Statehood Action Seen

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Jackson (D-Wash.) Wednesday predicted the present session of Congress will approve statehood for both Hawaii and Alaska—or neither.

The Washington senator said he does not believe the Senate will pass a bill calling for admission into the union of Hawaii alone. Sizing up statehood possibilities, he told a newsman he feels the Eisenhower administration "made a regrettable mistake" in its decision to push legislation only to admit Hawaii.

"Under Democratic administrations," he declared, "the two bills have been brought up together to avoid partisanship. Pushing the Hawaii bill without Alaska has turned statehood into a partisan fight which is unfortunate."

Jackson predicted the Senate Interior Committee would vote to separate the Alaska and Hawaii bills for consideration, and approve the Hawaii measure for Senate consideration.

But when the Hawaii bill reaches the Senate, Jackson said, Alaskan supporters will offer an amendment to combine the two bills again. He said he felt such a move would succeed, thereby sending the bill to conference with the House which has passed a statehood bill for Hawaii only.

### Schools Aid Atom Research

RICHLAND, Wash. (AP) — Seven Pacific Northwest schools are doing atomic energy research with grants from the Atomic Energy Commission, the AEC said Tuesday.

The announcement said that \$2,205,667 has been set aside for the research work at the Universities of Washington, Oregon and Idaho, state colleges of Washington and Oregon, Oregon Medical College and Reed College.

Projects, some of which already have been completed, include studies of the effects of radiation and radioactive materials on aquatic life, absorption of mineral elements in diseased and healthy Western white pine by use of radioactive materials, mobilization of radioactive emitters from bone and development of cyclotrons, the AEC said.
