Guided Missiles, Atom Armed, New Aid In Germany

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States is arming its forces in Germany with guided missiles capable of carrying atomic warheads hundreds of miles into Red-held territory.

The Air Force announced tersely last night that it will send two pilotless bomber squadrons to Germany this year. No details were given.

This move seemed to fit into basic U. S. strategy defined by Secretary of State Dulles in a New York speech Tuesday and affirmed by President Eisenhower at his news conference the next day.

The strategy, Dulles said, is based on "massive retaliatory power" to deter Soviet aggression.

In this connection, the decision to augment the fire power of American forces helping defend Western Europe immediately raised a question:

Would this mean fewer American troops in Europe?

"No, not in itself," Secretary of Defense Charles E. Wilson told reporters yesterday. He didn't say more.

The two squadrons bound for Germany will be equipped with B61 Matador missiles. These have been in mass production at the Baltimore plant of the Glenn L. Martin Co. for more than a year.

The Air Force did not disclose the number of missiles in a squadron, but it is believed several hundred may be allotted to each. By comparison, a squadron of jet fighters numbers about 25 planes.

The Matador is the first offensive guided missile to be turned over to a tactical unit of the United States armed forces. Other such missiles with greater speed and wider range are being designed or are undergoing tests.

Woman Dies For Murder

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Dismal winter rain beat against the walls of Ohio Penitentiary Friday night as a plump, gray-haired grandmother died in the electric chair at 8 p. m. (EST).

Mrs. Dovie Blanche Dean, 55, convicted of murdering her husband by slipping rat poison into his milk, died silently and with downcast eyes. The state contended she killed him for his \$27,000 estate.

The husband of four months, Hawkins Dean, 68, died at their Clermont County farm near Owensville Aug. 22, 1952.

Mrs. Dean's last request made while waiting in an antechamber to the death house was to sing her favorite hymn, "We Have in Jesus a Saviour Born," which she requested hymn.

She was the second woman executed in Ohio's special bid. The first was Mrs. Anna Hahn of Cincinnati, a blonde accused of poisoning her suitors. A little more than a year ago, on Dec. 7, 1951, she was carried to the chair to die. "Don't do that to me, no! no!" Mrs. Dean had been called a woman who can't cry.

NEW YORK (AP) — Gov. Allan Shivers of Texas has suggested that farm surpluses instead of money be used in conducting this country's foreign aid program.

Shivers, a Democrat who supported Eisenhower in the last election, spoke last night before the New York Southern Society.

The use of farm surpluses, he said, "would seem more logical, somehow, than paying off both the farmer and the foreigner in cash and letting the surplus food spoil in storage."

Gunman To Face Court In Attempt To Win Freedom From Oregon Penitentiary

Gerald T. Macomber, notorious Oregon gunman, now serving a life term in Oregon State Prison, has asked Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg to have six convicts subpoenaed for a habeas corpus hearing which opens Monday in Medford.

Judge Vandenberg will preside at the hearing through which Macomber will attempt to gain his freedom. Two other circuit judges have been disqualified to hear the case.

Macomber claims he was illegally sentenced to prison and that he was denied the right to obtain legal counsel or have the grand jury investigate his case.

The 30-year-old gunman has figured prominently in Oregon crime news since 1950. While sought for a series of burglaries that year in Linn County, he hid out for a week in the Cascade Hills. Finally the fugitive fled on a white horse under a hail of bullets.
