

# Indian Bills In Congress Ask Freedom

WASHINGTON (AP) — Bills to end federal jurisdiction over eight Indian tribal groups, including the Klamath and the Grand Ronde-Siletz groups in Oregon, have been submitted to Congress, Secretary of Interior McKay said Wednesday.

Also affected would be all Indians in California, Florida, New York, and the Flatheads of Montana, the Turtle Mountain Chippewas of North Dakota and four tribes under jurisdiction of the Indian Bureau's Potawatomi field office at Horton, Kan.

McKay said the bills vary in detail, but that all provide for an eventual end of federal trusteeship over Indian property, and would make the Indians subject to the same federal and state laws as other citizens.

He said the bills would affect about 66,000 Indians, roughly one-seventh of the Indian population as estimated by the Indian Bureau.

McKay said federal responsibility for such special services to the Indians as roads, health and education also would be ended.

"Ample time is allowed, however, for the completion of arrangements under which the Indians would receive customary services from state and local agencies."

## Cugat Nailed By Robber

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Bandleader Xavier Cugat and his voluptuous wife, vocalist Abba Lane, told police they were kidnaped and robbed of nearly \$20,000 in jewelry and cash last night by a masked gunman who lay in wait for them in Cugat's car.

The couple had just finished a performance at an auto show on Pan Pacific Auditorium and were on their way to a movie. As they

rolled slowly out of the parking lot in Cugat's expensive white convertible, the bandit rose up from the back seat. He wore a white handkerchief over his face and held a .45 caliber automatic, Cugat said.

Cugat reported the gunman made them drive to a parking area and there took a \$9,000 10-karat solitaire and a \$2,500 diamond wedding ring from Miss Lane, and a \$2,600 wristwatch, \$5,000 diamond ring and \$150 in cash from the bandleader.

The gunman then ordered them out of the car and cautioned them: "Keep walking. Don't look back or I'll drill you."

The car was still on the parking lot when Cugat returned there with police.

## O & C Timber Changes Asked

PORTLAND (AP) — Several changes intended to help in the sale of timber from O & C land were recommended by the O & C Advisory Board Wednesday.

O & C land is in large tracts in Western Oregon, once granted to the Oregon and California Railroad, but taken back by the federal government years ago. It is administered by the Bureau of Land Management as timber and grazing land.

One of the recommendations would allow loggers outside a given marketing area to bid on green timber tracts if the first offering brings no bids from loggers inside the marketing area.

Another would allow the Bureau of Land Management to determine whether to measure timber in the tracts by scaling or cruising. The board earlier had advocated scaling as the only method.

## Radars Speed Check Slated

PORTLAND (AP) — Police here plan to start using radar to check speeders in about 10 days.

Police Chief James Purcell disclosed this Wednesday, and won approval from the Traffic Safety Commission after he said he intended to give warning tickets, and not use the radar for making arrests.

Results of the radar checks will be used in planning traffic control, he added.

The Washington State Patrol and police in some cities have used radar in making arrests. Some motorists have fought this in court, contending the use of radar constitutes a speed trap.

## Sailor Facing Trial For Murder

LITTLETON, Colo. (AP) — John E. Boney, 32, sailor from Salem, Ore., was seen with Mrs. Dorothy Gall shortly before she was killed near here last September, Dist. Atty. George Priest asserted Wednesday.

Boney, who is on trial in district court on a murder charge, denies any connection with the crime.

Priest attempted to introduce a coroner's certificate giving the cause of death as "injuries received by beating and tapping." Judge Harold H. Davies would not admit it, saying that the jury must decide the cause of death.

## Brothers Reunited After Forty Two Year Separation

The amazing reunion of two brothers, after a 42-year separation was revealed here this week by Maurice Miller, nephew of the two men, who through a quirk of fate, learned the identity of one, lost to the family since he was a child.

Miller is circulation manager for the Herald and News.

Through his efforts, the brothers met recently in Holly, Mich., home of Frank Leasy, when M-Sgt. Alonzo Deveny, once James Nephew, U. S. Air Force, Harrow, Middlesex, England, arrived in the U. S.

The men, last in a family of eight brothers and sisters, were born in Portland and were separated when Frank was six and James was four.

James, for a brief time lived here in 1926 and carried a paper route for the Herald and News.

Soon after he was adopted, in Josephine County, and became the son of John and Edith Deveny and his name changed. The adoption became public record and was published years ago in a copy of the General Laws of Oregon, under "Adoptions."

His foster parents died. Through the years he had attempted to find some trace of his original parentage with no success.

At the time of the Algoma flood here in 1940 both brothers, were in Klamath Falls; Frank employed by his nephew Maurice Miller as driver on the Herald and News paper route to Chiloquin; James was employed as a taxi driver for Fred Duke. Neither knew the other was here.

Their ways parted and James went into the service going overseas. Then destiny stepped in. Miller, sitting in his office one

day, leafed through the column of state laws and discovered the name, James Nephew Leasy, adopted by the Deveny family.

He inserted an advertisement in the Grants Pass Daily Courier that brought results.

Letters followed and James, located in England, returned to the states. He goes to an Oklahoma Air Base for further assignments. His brother Frank will continue his work with the Fisher Body Co., Flint, Mich.

A second uncle, is Harold Miller, 5620 N. E. Alberta Avenue, Portland.
