

Housing Program Message Today; Will Outline Major Changes In Plans

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower sends Congress today an annual message on housing, outlining major changes in the federal housing program.

The message, which will be reported by the House and Senate, will seek to fix the housing program on a permanent basis, with "proper encouragement" from the government.

Major responsibility for providing good housing on reasonable terms, Housing Administrator Albert M. Cole has predicted that the plan, if adopted by Congress as a package, could keep new home construction at the "very high level" of more than a million starts a year. About 1,100,000 starts were recorded in 1953.

Cole headed the 23-member presidential advisory committee which issued its report Dec. 15. Officials said Eisenhower has accepted the committee's basic ideas but has worked out compromises on a few disputed points.

In his budget message last week Eisenhower said he would recommend continuation of an "interim" public housing program calling for the start of 35,000 dwellings for low-income families in fiscal 1955, starting July 1. This is the figure now authorized for subsidized rental dwellings, but Congress last year provided for only 20,000 new units.

However, the White House program looks to the eventual elimination of public housing by offering much more liberal Federal Housing Administration down payment and mortgage terms for inexpensive new houses and for the repair and modernization of old houses.

The advisory committee urged a two-year trial of FHA mortgage insurance requiring no down payment on houses costing \$8,000 or less and making the principal payable in 40 years. With the mortgage debt so extended, monthly pay-

ments would be as low as moderate rentals in most cities.

Also recommended by the Committee and understood to have been adopted in principle at least by the President are proposals for:

A new "urban renewal" program providing federal loans and grants to cities for use not only in eradicating slums but in preventing the decay of blighted neighborhoods.

More generous FHA terms on loans for the repair and improvement of aging houses.

A lease and purchase plan under which FHA would encourage builders to put up rental houses whose tenants could eventually buy them without down payment, when their income increases.

A reorganization of the housing agencies.

A start on a plan to get the government out of the business of buying mortgages from banks, to support housing credit. This function, it is proposed, would be handed over to private capital for the most part.

The blaze started in a quantity of waste paper in the basement.

Widow Marries Chef

She and Jack Wengert, 40, Las Vegas chef, were married yesterday in the home of a private detective, Glenn Bodell, who uncovered much of the evidence that freed her. She was divorced last year from Russell Johnson.

Mr. Wengert, 35, was convicted of second degree murder in the death here of her former landlady, Mrs. Jane Jones, 72. She was sentenced to 10 to 12 years but legal evidence was turned up that Mrs. Jones was suffering from an incurable brain disease and would have died if she and Mrs. Wengert had gotten into a fight.

Mr. Wengert was freed by the State Board of Pardons and Paroles last Wednesday, after serving two years and nine months.
