Korean War Bonus Eyed

PORTLAND (AP) — A bill to pay Oregon state bonuses to veterans of the Korean War will be introduced in the next Legislature by Sen. Richard L. Neuberger, Portland Democrat.

He asked Sam R. Haley, legislative counsel, to prepare it. Then he said he had tried to introduce a similar bill in the last legislative session but it was rejected by the Rules Committee because it was too late. That, he said, was the reason for the early request for preparation of the bill this time.

His proposal as outlined in his letter to Haley:

Following the general pattern of the World War I bonus with \$10 for each month of domestic and \$15 for each month of foreign service, with the termination date left open pending declaration by the President that Korean hostilities are at an end. He proposed the same administrative and financing procedures as for the World War II bonus.

RECOVERED

DELHI, India (AP) — The British reported Thursday its forces recovered 49 hostages there last October by heading off a train in the border town of Assam. The members of friendly forces were released during an ambush in which 70 persons on an Indian train were killed.

Smoking, Cancer Held Related

ST. LOUIS (AP) — A St. Louis surgeon active in research says the only persons who don't believe a definite relationship exists between cigarette smoking and cancer are those who have not made statistical studies of the question.

Dr. Evaris A. Graham made that statement last night as he

read a paper before the Washington University Medical Society, 1950.

More than 3,000 cases have been involved in 12 statistical studies made since the original report, he said, adding: "It is significant that every one of the studies concludes that a definite relationship exists."

AMA Blasts Health Deal

WASHINGTON (AP) — The American Medical Assn. (AMA) protested Thursday that "a distorted picture" of the nation's health needs has been drawn in an effort to influence public support for a government-controlled medical care program.

As a "positive program" to cushion the economic shocks of illness, an AMA spokesman urged continued reliance on voluntary health insurance for those who can afford it and direct help from local and state governments for the indigent.

Government health "subsidy" is not desirable, he continued, and the problems of the chronically ill and the poor can be solved without
