### Quaker Minister, Educator Slated for Talk at YMCA

Cecil Hinshaw, Quaker minister and educator, will speak February 3 at the YMCA, 725 S. Street, on the subject, "An Adequate and Moral National Defense."

Dr. Hinshaw is being presented under the auspices of the Fellowship of Reconciliation in cooperation with the Portland regional office of the American Friends Service Committee.

After graduating from Friends University in Wichita, Kansas, Cecil Hinshaw did graduate work at the University of Denver, Harvard University and the Iliff School of Theology from which he received the Doctor of Theology degree. For several years he was engaged in pastoral work in Friends' meetings. In 1940 he was appointed professor of Bible and Religion at Friends University resigning three years later to go to William Penn College in Oskaloosa, Iowa, as dean of the college. Six months later he became president of the college in which capacity he served until 1949. Since 1949 he has been lecturing for the American Friends Service Committee and the Fellowship of Reconciliation.

Cecil Hinshaw and his family make their home on a 17-acre farm in a rural area of New Hampshire. "Recognition of the need to practice on a community level the principles and ideas involved in our lectures," according to Dr. Hinshaw, was one of the factors influencing their decision to live on a farm.

### Greater Europe Mission Man To Speak at Mt. Laki Church

"Europe is 'looked over' by millions of tourists but overlooked by America's Christians," says the Rev. Royal L. Peck who is speaking at the Mt. Laki Community Church Sunday, January 21, at 11 a.m. according to the pastor, "The Greater Europe Mission maintains the European Bible Institute in Paris, France, where young people from 10 different nations in Europe are receiving Bible training," continues Lyons, "After which they are to return to their own people with the Gospel. The work in Europe is under the direction of Robert P. Evans, former Navy Chaplain and internationally known youth leader."

"While I was touring Europe as a member of an evangelistic team under Youth for Christ International," the Rev. Peck says, "I saw first hand the spiritual need in that continent where at least 200 million people have never laid eyes on a Bible. When I returned to the United States, my family and I proposed to give our lives to do a permanent work over there. We will be sailing soon for Italy."

The Rev. Peck served in the U. S. Naval Submarine Service during World War II. He is a graduate of Wheaton College, Wheaton, Illinois, and Northern Baptist Seminary, Chicago. For four and a half years he served as pastor of the Crawford Bible Church in Chicago.



THE REV. ROYAL L. PECK

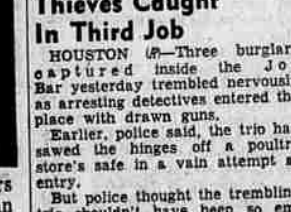

### Fort Klamath Church Board Reports on Regular Meeting

FORT KLAMATH—The Rev. Edmund Stanton, pastor of the Fort Klamath and Chilquien Methodist churches, and members of the local church board met Wednesday evening, January 20, at the church here.

The meeting has formerly been held on the 4th Monday every two months, but in order not to conflict with the Christian Men's club, regular board meetings will be held the 4th Wednesday every two months. The next business meeting will be March 24.

Conducting the session was Raymond S. Loosley, chairman of the board. Those present voted to join the Klamath Council of Churches, which holds only two meetings each year, one to elect officers and plan the year's program, the second a dinner meeting. Named as representatives to attend from the Fort Klamath Community Methodist church were Mr. and Mrs. Hansford T. (Mike) Williams.

The Rev. Stanton was granted leave of absence during the last week of February. With his family he will join relatives on a trip to Berkeley, California, where he will attend the Civic School of Religion. The Stanton will visit other relatives in Southern California.

The pastor announced that on February 2, 3 and 4, the Oregon Council of Churches is convening at Salem, open to ministers and laymen alike. Housing will be furnished. A charge of \$2 will be made for the first person registering from a church, and \$1 for each additional member attending. The meeting will feature several outstanding speakers, the Rev. Stanton said, and will be most instructive.

For the third consecutive year, the local church will enter the Town and Country Church Improvement contest sponsored by the Oregon Council of Churches in cooperation with the Sears Roebuck foundation. The Fort Klamath church was awarded a cash prize of \$75 for improvements made and listed in the 1953 contest.

The Rev. Stanton also announced that Sunday, February 14, will be "Race Relations" Sunday, and that the theme of his specially prepared sermon will be "Brotherhood." A voluntary contribution will be received, to be given to a Negro college, he said.

Also, during March, exchange evangelistic services between two churches will be held for a week. In all probability, the guest pastor at the local church will be the Rev. Wayne Brown of Myrtle Creek. He will be accompanied to all services during the week by the Rev. Stanton, who will in turn spend a week conducting services at the church of the visiting minister.

### Marine Acquitted In Gun Slaying

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP)—A general court-martial acquitted Marine Pfc. L. C. Kemp, 23, of San Angelo, Tex., yesterday of murder in the shotgun slaying of a civilian gardener here Dec. 2.

Kemp admitted he shot the gardener, Irving V. LeFever, 27, at the San Diego Marine Corps Recruit Depot after a dispute over respect for the morning raising of the national colors.

The Marine was guarding brig prisoners with the shotgun the morning of the shooting. He testified that LeFever threatened the security of his prisoners.
