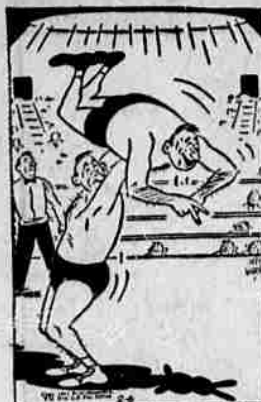

Owls On Short End Of 89-60

LA GRANDE (Special)—Eastern Oregon romped over Oregon Tech here last night, 89-60, to bulge its lead in the Oregon Collegiate Conference.

The Mountaineers went ahead to stay late in the first quarter on Bob Adrien's hook shot and held an imposing 44-28 halftime lead.

Oregon Tech used a slow, deliberate offense through the first quarter but opened up with a fast break going into the second when the Owls trailed 10-18.

Oregon Tech rolled in 20 points in the last frame but was too far away to catch up. Bob Edgren counted 18 for to lead Orvtech, 15 of them coming in the last period.

Eastern Oregon hit 34 of 86 attempts from the field for a 39.3 percentage, outshooting the Owls who finished with a poor 237 on 18 of 76.

Five EOC cagers found two figures, besides Schadewitz' 20. Larry Pryse had 17, Ken Westenskow 14, Adrian 13 and Vance Savage 11.

Don Sulphin added 10 to Edgren's 18. The two teams meet again tonight on the La Grande floor.

Wolves Win By 61 to 48

REDDING (Special)—The Klamath Pelicans fell apart in the last six minutes last night as the Shasta Wolves of Redding posted a 61-48 victory in the first of a two-game King-X series here.

Not more than five points separated the teams until two minutes into the fourth period when Shasta held a 41-37 lead. Then the Wolves went on a scoring binge that netted 20 points when the Pelicans switched from zone defense to man to man and the Redding cagers ran away from them.

Ken Forry and Dave Brewer led the late assault on the Klamath five, although reliable Mike Preaseau was the game's spark with 18 points.

Preaseau not only hit on a variety of shots but he was superb on defense, stealing the ball and knocking down shots, and dominated the boards.

The Pelicans jumped into a 14-11 first-quarter lead in a nip-and-tuck first frame.

It was 24-21 at the half and 41-34 heading into the last period. The Pel closed the count to 41-37 when the Wolves started to roll.

Shasta also won the junior varsity preliminary with a 51-47 victory over the Klamath team. Ken Carter scored 17 for Shasta, Jerry Barker and Marlin Causey had 12 each for Klamath Falls.

Bryant Switch Miffs Kentucky

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP)—Kentucky athletic officials appeared Saturday in a frame of mind to hold football coach Paul Bryant to his contract and possibly block his agreement to coach at Texas A and M.

The storm stirred up by Bryant's sudden announcement Thursday that he was leaving with nine years to run on his contract was whipped to a fury Friday, when 1. Dr. H. L. Donovan, school president, said he would not recommend acceptance of the resignation by the athletic association.

Donovan said he would let the association handle the resignation problem. "Coming at this particular time, with spring football practice in the offing, and on such late notice, it poses a difficult problem for the university athletic association," Donovan said.
