It's the OCC windup for the Owls, although the Vikings have two games left with Oregon College (one tonight) and a pair with league-leading Eastern Oregon.

It was EOC that ruined OTI's last title hopes with a series sweep in La Grande over the weekend, but Portland State started it with a series split in Portland in late January.

In that series, Porter, ex-McMinnville prep star, rolled in 31 and 20 points to play the major role against the Owls.

He's the Vikings' main scoring threat and will probably team with forwards Ron Brown and Richard Green and guards Jim Perkin and John Fought.

Skeet O'Connell, Tech's headman, will have his one-two scoring punch, Jerry Wyatt and Don Sutphin, on the starting line. Don Hubble will probably open with Wyatt at forward, Gary Dorn with Sutphin at guard, while Keith Thompson is down for a starting assignment at center.
