The opening is to acquaint the public with the new combined business, formerly Bud's Photo Service and Carmichael Newsstand, in the new building next door to the former newsstand location.

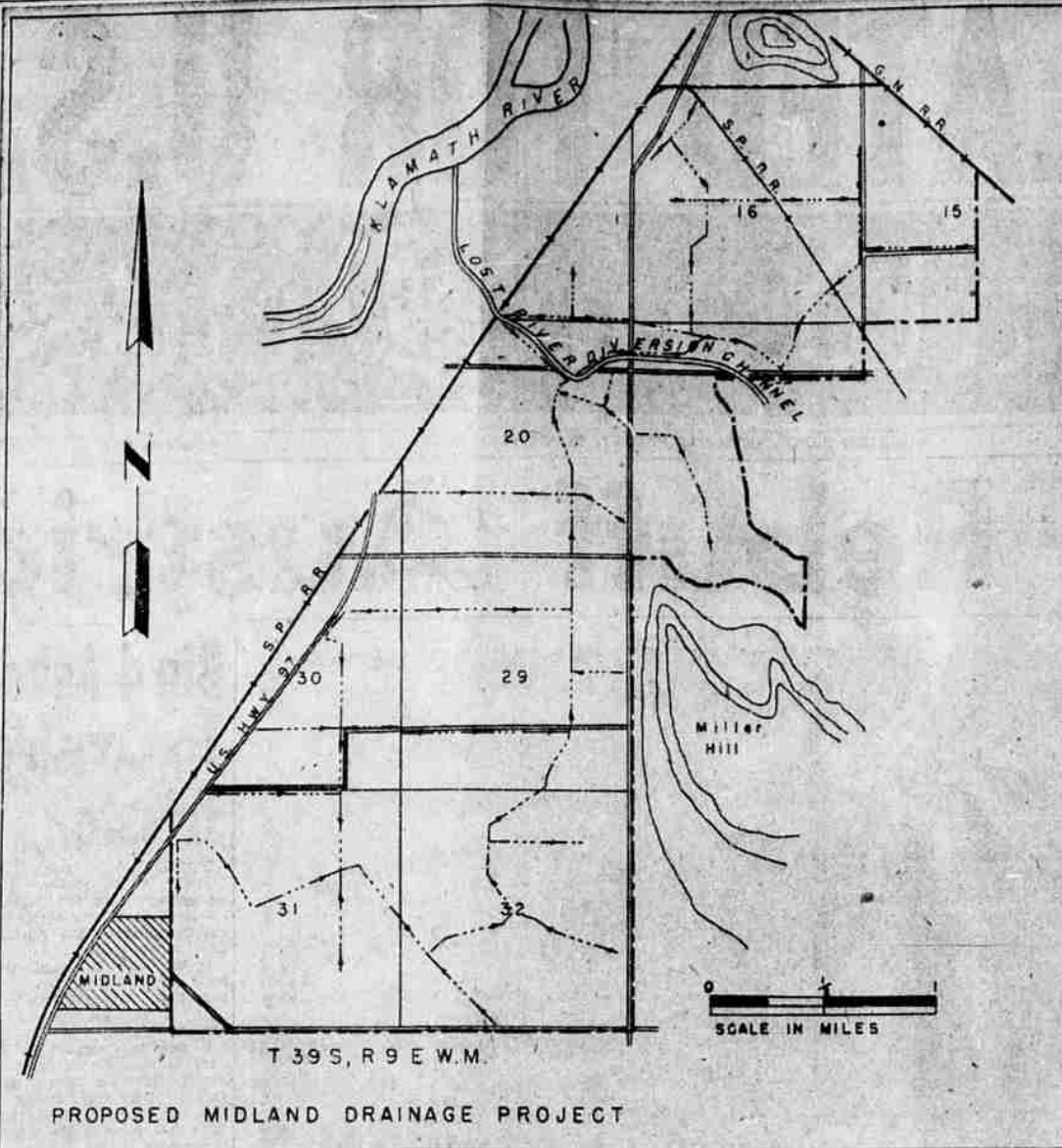

### State Commission Lists Job Totals

SALEM (AP) — Employment in non-farm jobs in Oregon has increased every year since 1949, the State Unemployment Compensation Commission said Thursday.

The commission said the state had an average of 467,000 non-agricultural workers in 1953, which was 2,600 more than in 1952.

The total was 51,200 more than in 1949, and 10 per cent above the highest wartime total.

### Soil District To Hold Meet

The annual meeting of the Klamath Soil Conservation District has been set for 7:30 p.m. February 16, at the Midland Grange Hall, it was announced today by Chairman Myron Taylor.

On the agenda for the meeting will be the annual report and plans for 1964; Election of a supervisor to fill the unexpired term of Kelly Robinette and an open discussion of the proposed Midland Drainage District.

Included in the speakers who will discuss the proposed district will be: Carroll H. Dwyer, soil conservation service economist, Portland, whose topic will be "Economic feasibility"; E. L. Stephens and J. P. Elmore, Bureau of Reclamation officials; "bureau requirements and obtaining interest free government money"; Lyle C. Smith, SCS engineer, Klamath Falls, who will present tentative plans and costs and A. R. Gross, Klamath experimental station, will speak on drainage benefits.

All persons in the Klamath soil conservation district and those interested in the proposed drainage district and their families are invited to attend. Refreshments will be served.

### Astoria Union Asks Dredging

ASTORIA (AP) — Dredging will start next week on Slip Two, waterfront workers were assured Wednesday. They were at a port meeting to protest the grounding of a Japanese ship here earlier this week and loss of business and pay when the vessel left without completing its loading.

Port officials admitted their faces were red about the grounding, but assured the protesting longshoremen that immediate action would be taken to deepen the slip.

They said that this was only the third grounding of a vessel in the port in 13 years and that during the period the port had spent \$90,000 to dredge its slips.

Complaints and questions about the operation of the port were heard from representatives of 12 different union locals at the meeting.

### Correction On Tax Instructions

WASHINGTON (AP) — Internal Revenue Service officials explained Thursday the circumstances under which the costs of participation in group hospitalization and health plans may be deducted in making out an income tax return.

If paid on a monthly or other regular basis, like insurance premiums, these costs may be considered as medical expenses.

They may not be deducted separately but must be lumped with other medical and dental expenses in determining whether total medical expenses will reach a deductible level.

The Associated Press erroneously stated on Jan. 27 that group hospitalization costs could be deducted separately.
