Reds Purge Siberian Premier

LONDON (AP) — The Kremlin Saturday denounced the premier of Kazakhstan S.S.R. for "shortcomings and mistakes" and launched a campaign for a "speedy liquidation" of Communist errors in that central Asian republic of the Soviet Union.

Moscow bared to the world its troubles in the vast republic behind the Urals — rich in minerals for the Soviet atomic program — in a broadcast over the official government radio at Alma Ata.

Kazakhstan Skaya Pravda — party mouthpiece — severely criticized Premier Y. B. Taybekov, his deputy premier, and two Communist party secretaries recently purged.

Indochina Situation Said In Need Of New Decisions

By BRUCE BLOSSAT The military situation in Indochina evidently is slowly deteriorating for the French. Washington is aware that some new, hard decisions will soon have to be made if the territory is to be kept out of Communist hands.

There is perhaps slight reason to doubt that recent Viet Minh rebel advances in Laos are designed to impress Western diplomats meeting with Russian Foreign Minister Molotov in Berlin. But the unhappy fact is, the French are not able to prevent these demonstrations of mobility.

Close observers both in France and Indo-China say the French at home and the French soldiery in the field are terribly tired of this eight-year-old war. They want it to end. Moreover, all energy expended to the purpose of far has not produced a native Viet Nameese army to which the French could entrust the defense of Indochinese soil.
