### California Leads In Cooperatives

Most recent statistics of the Farmers Cooperative Service show almost 7.4 million members on the rolls of 10,143 farmer cooperatives in 1951-52, an increase of about four per cent. The number of cooperatives also increased by 92 associations.

California remained in front in net business done in the states. Estimates for California in 1951-52 show 447 associations with headquarters in the state; 456 associations doing business in the state; 126,705 members in the state; and \$243,638,000 net business after adjusting for duplication.

### Modoc County Bull Sale Set

Plans for the annual event were made this week, with new officers elected, sale date decided upon and members to be allowed.

Sale dates have been set for October 9 and 10. This is a week later than usual and falls on Saturday and Sunday. Previous years the grading was on Sunday and the sale on Monday.

### Cooperatives Get Revenue Tax Changes

The Internal Revenue Service announced recently that the time for filing the Exempt Cooperative Association Income Tax Return, Form 990-C, and payment of any income tax due from an exempt farmers' cooperative marketing and purchasing association for a taxable year beginning in 1953 has been extended until the fifteenth day of the ninth month following the close of the taxable year. This extension represents a change in the date for filing and payment contained in paragraph D on page 1 of the General Instructions accompany Form 990-C.

Cooperative associations concerned are advised, however, that interest at the rate of six per cent per annum will be assessed and collected on the amount determined as the tax from the original due date for payment of the tax, the fifteenth day of the third month following the close of the taxable year, until the date such tax is paid.

The payment of the tax, or any installment thereof, made in advance of the filing of the return will stay the accumulation of interest on the amount of such payment from the time it is paid.
