



BAKED ONIONS WITH MUSTARD SAUCE is a taste treat that will add new interest to a Lenten meal. Onions may be served in many ways, but here is a simple, easy-to-fix recipe providing a fine flavor combination. When ready to serve, a mustard flavored cream sauce gives the final touch in taste and food value as well. Milk, which is such a versatile dairy food to use for cooking as well as for drinking, lends itself to a sauce of this kind.

PERK UP THE ONION

There are always foods which fall into the plentiful class. One group of such foods is the dairy food group. Not only are these foods readily obtainable, but they give so much food value for each dollar spent.

Combined with our own Klamath Russet potatoes or onions, fine food values are provided for your family at minimum cost.

BAKED ONIONS

8 large mild onions
1 cup toasted bread crumbs
1/2 cup melted butter
2 tablespoons chopped parsley
1/2 teaspoon poultry seasoning
1/4 teaspoon salt
Dash of pepper

Cook onions in boiling, slightly salted water until tender, about 30 minutes. Drain. Cool. Remove centers, leaving at least a half inch shell. Stuff each onion with mix-

ture of remaining ingredients, adding some chopped onion. Place close together in buttered casserole or baking pan and bake in moderate oven, 350 degrees, for about 30 minutes. Serve with mustard sauce.

MUSTARD SAUCE

2 1/2 tablespoons butter
2 1/2 tablespoons flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
Dash of pepper
1 1/2 cups milk
1 tablespoon prepared mustard
2 tablespoons lemon juice

Melt butter in a saucepan over low heat and blend in flour and salt. Add milk slowly and cook, stirring constantly, until sauce is smooth and thickened. Blend in mustard, and just before serving, slowly add lemon juice, stirring quickly. Serves six.

REMOVING STAINS

Embroider hoops are convenient to use for holding material in place while removing stains. Boiling water from the tea kettle will remove berry and wine stains from table linen.

SPICED PEARS

Drain juice from a No. 2 1/2 can of pears, add to it 1/4 cup vinegar, 1 stick cinnamon and 8 whole cloves. Bring to boil and simmer three minutes. Then pour back over pears and set in refrigerator to chill. Serve with meat or fowl.
