

CONGRESS SCENE OF SHOOTING

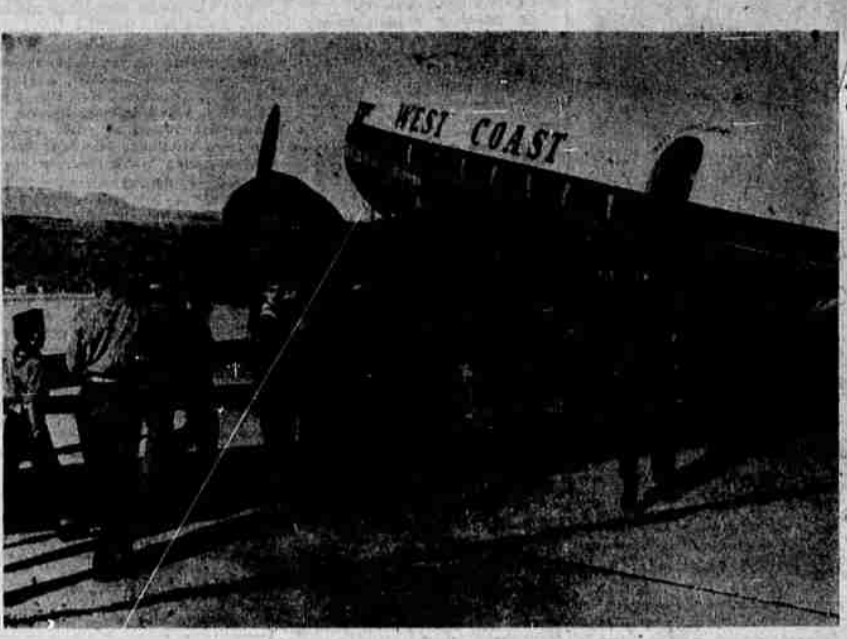
