Bishop Leipzig Visits Here For Confirmation Services

The Most Rev. Francis P. Leipzig, D. D., Bishop of Baker City Diocese, conferred the sacrament of Confirmation on 183 candidates at Sacred Heart Catholic Church Tuesday, February 23.

Out-of-town priests assisting at the ceremony were the Rev. Father James O'Connor, Lakeview; the Rev. Father Cornelius O'Connor, Tulelake; the Rev. Father William Stone, Chiloquin; the Rev. Father John Phelan, Merrill.

Candidates walked in procession from the rectory with an honor guard of fourth degree members, Knights of Columbus.

Bishop Leipzig examined the candidates on Christian doctrine prior to administering the sacrament, and gave a brief talk following to the 14 children and 38 adults who received the sacrament.

Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament followed the confirmation ceremony.

Appropriate hymns were sung by the Sacred Heart Academy high school choir.

Bishop Leipzig administered the sacrament of Confirmation in Merrill on Wednesday evening, to 42 candidates; in Lakeview on Thursday, to a class of about 50; in Chiloquin on Friday evening, where approximately 20 persons were confirmed.

From Klamath, the visiting dignitary continued on to Weed for a celebration Sunday in which Ellis J. Louie was made a Knight of St. Gregory. Other Catholic churchmen present included the Most Rev. Robert G. Armstrong, Bishop of the Sacramento Diocese and the Most Rev. Thomas A. Connolly, Archbishop of Seattle.
