CAB Penalty Hits Godfrey

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Civil Aeronautics Board decided Friday to suspend Arthur Godfrey's pilot certificate for six months, effective March 16, as a penalty for careless flying at Teterboro, N. J., airport Jan. 7.

The action came in the form of a recommended decision by CAB Safety Examiner Albert H. Ruppard. Godfrey has the right of appeal, but a recommended decision by a safety examiner customarily is adopted by the board as its own decision.

The recommended penalty is surprisingly severe in view of the fact that the Civil Aeronautics Administration had asked for a suspension of "at least 30 days."

Godfrey, star of radio and television and a flying enthusiast, has denied that either intent or carelessness was involved when his plane roared close to the control tower in a takeoff at Teterboro.

The CAA contended that he deliberately "buzzed" the tower with his twin-engine DC3 in annoyance because he was not permitted to

take off from the runway of his choice.

Six persons told the CAB examiner they heard Godfrey "talk back" to the Teterboro control tower after the narrow miss.

They said that when asked if he had had mechanical trouble, the radio-television star replied, "No, that's a normal takeoff for Teterboro."

Godfrey said his plane was buffeted by cross winds on takeoff, and his only thought at the time was to avoid collision.

Godfrey was on the air at a CBS studio in New York when the suspension was announced.

Suit Dropped By McCarthy

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) Friday dropped his two million dollar libel and slander suit against former Sen. William Benton (D-Conn.).

Benton said it was dropped because McCarthy "refuses to face examination" in court and because McCarthy "could never have won it because I told the truth about him and he knew it."

McCarthy said it was withdrawn because his lawyers could find no one who believed Benton's statements about him and it would be a "waste" to go to trial unless he could show he was damaged.

The case, dating back to March 1952, was due to come up for pre-trial conference next Monday.

McCarthy had asked the big damages on the contention that Benton libeled him by telling a Senate elections subcommittee in September 1951, that McCarthy permitted perjury, fraud and calculated deceit on the American people in pressing his charges of Communist infiltration of the government.

Sultan Hurt In Bombing

PARIS (AP) — The French Press Agency said the Sultan of Morocco, Moulay Mohammed Ben Rifa, was injured Friday when a bomb explosion in a mosque at Marrakech, where he was saying his prayers.

The Sultan reportedly was slightly injured in the forehead and was able to walk unaided to his car. His chief political supporter, Thami El Glaoui, the Pasha of Marrakech, was with the Sultan but escaped injury, the dispatch said.

Arafa succeeded to the Moroccan throne after the French ousted his nephew, Sidi Mohammed Ben Youssef, from the sultanate because of his increasing support of nationalist demands for independence for French Morocco.

Ben Youssef was sent off to exile on the island of Madagascar and French plans are to send him on to the Pacific Island of Tahiti—as far away as possible from the seething North African protectorate.

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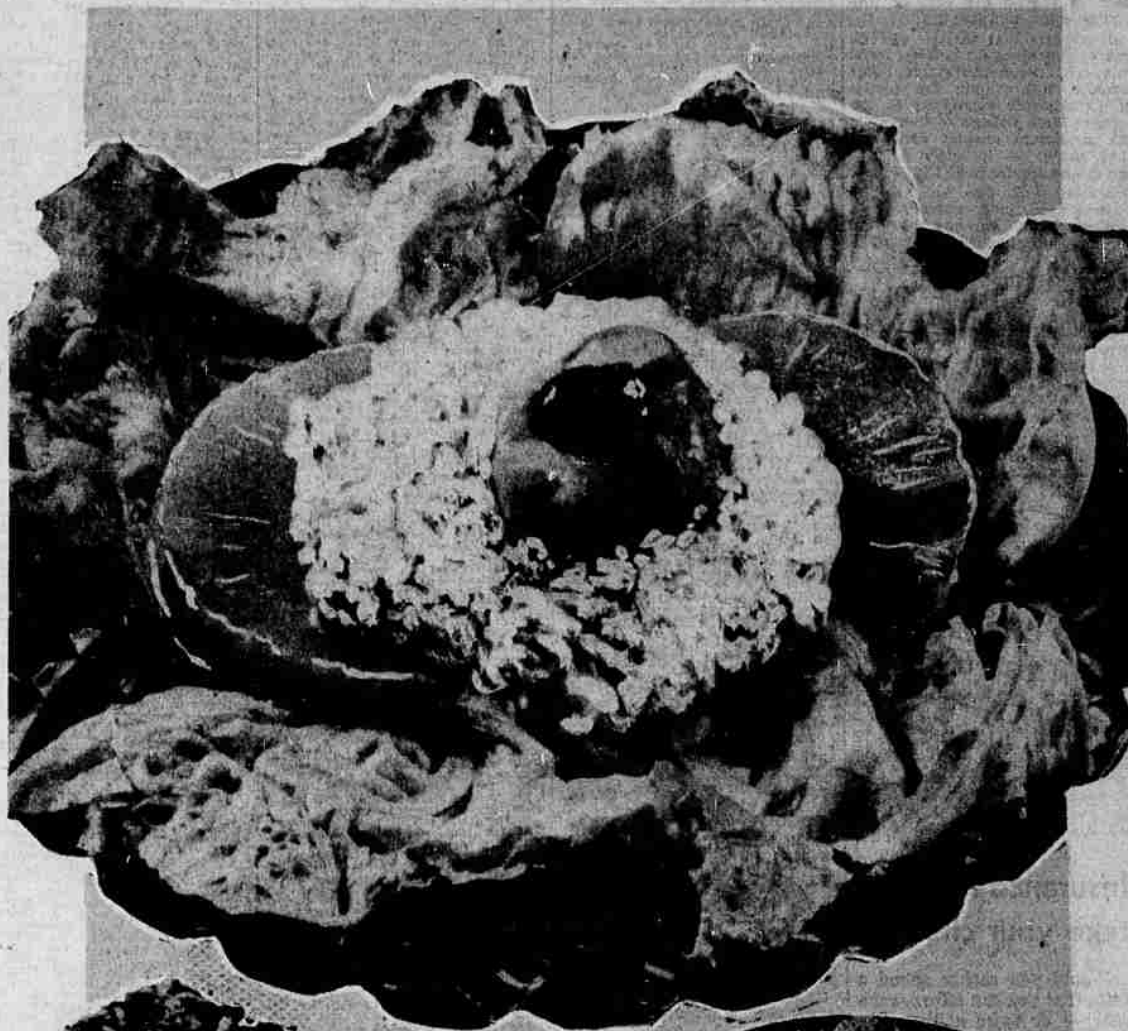
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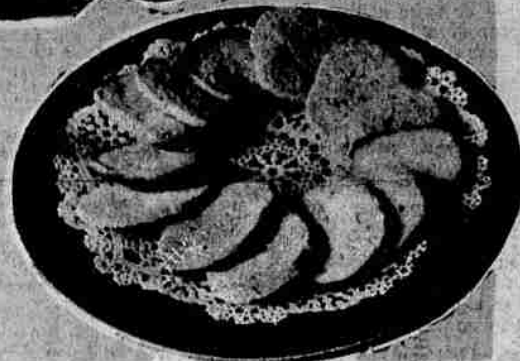


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
