Yearly Copco Earnings Told

Net income of the California Oregon Power Company (Medford, Oregon) for the year ended December 31, 1953, after all charges, including preferred dividends of \$14,785, was \$2,282,212 or \$1.76 per share on the 1,300,000 shares of common stock outstanding. This compared with earnings of \$2,202,472 or \$1.69 per common share for the previous year, according to an announcement made yesterday by A. S. Cummins, president.

Gross revenue for the year amounted to \$14,355,114, an increase of \$420,409 or 3.02 per cent over 1952.

Mr. Cummins pointed out that the year just concluded was one of continued sound growth. Sales were 1,276,164,630 kilowatt-hours, an increase of 4.57 per cent over the previous year. Average residential consumption was 7,331.98 kilowatt-hours per customer, a gain of 593.54 kilowatt-hours over last year.

In his report to stockholders Mr. Cummins stated that, "Last December, the Public Utilities Commission of Oregon and the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California acted favorably on Copco's applications, made in May of last year, for higher electric rates. The authorized increase in rates will result in additional gross revenues to the company of approximately \$2,100,000 annually from operations in California and Oregon. Full benefits from this additional revenue will be reflected in the company's 1954 operations."

Mr. Cummins also told stockholders that the large construction programs, which have been an important and necessary part of the company's activities for the past eight years, resulted in expenditures of nearly \$19,000,000 last year. Since World War II, the company has expended \$82,557,260 on new construction projects.

Globe Trotter On Probation

Gulliver was quite a traveler. But he had nothing on Darold Johnson, 38, who pleaded guilty to non-support of a minor child last Monday in Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg's Court.

Johnson, a \$10,000 a year federal civil service employee, is pretty much of a globe-trotter, according to his story. He worked on government projects in all parts of the world.

Johnson was arrested here on complaint of his former wife who said he failed to carry out a Seattle court order to pay her \$50 a month for support of their son. He was represented by Attorney Edwin E. Driscoll.

Judge Vandenberg placed Johnson on two years probation and ordered him to make the child support payments here. He said he would not restrict the defendant to the state of Oregon due to the nature of his work.

Vietnam Treaty Talks Opened

PARIS (AP) — France and Vietnam opened talks Monday designed to lead to a treaty of limited independence for the war-ravaged Indochinese state.

Premier Joseph Laniel and Prince Bao Lu, the Vietnamese premier, occupied the honored seats as the negotiations opened Monday morning in the ornate clock room of the ministry of foreign affairs.

Later, technical experts are expected to take over most of the work of the conference, which may last as long as three weeks.

Deliverwoman Wins Election

EASTHAMPTON, Mass. (AP) — Miss Katherine M. Root's intensive pre-dawn campaign along her newspaper route paid off last night. She was elected selectman, defeating Board Chairman Stanley Pacocchia 1,989 to 1,864.

Chosen Easthampton's 1953 "Woman of the Year," Miss Root delivered a hand-written appeal for votes along with the paper to each of her 182 Easthampton customers. Her delivery work starts at 4:30 a.m.

Before she could start getting out the vote here, Miss Root delivered papers by jeep to more than 300 rural customers in surrounding communities.

Citizenship Oath Given Objector

BALTIMORE (AP) — The Japanese-born wife of a Seventh Day Adventist minister was permitted yesterday to take her oath of citizenship without the customary swearing to bear arms for her country.

Mrs. Masu Sager of Takoma Park, Md., told Federal Judge William C. Coleman she would promise to do non-combatant service but said her religion would not allow her to swear to bear arms.

Under these conditions and after considerable questioning, Judge Coleman allowed her to take the oath of allegiance with the phrase stricken out.

Mau Mau Killed In Air, Land Strikes

NAIROBI, Kenya (AP) — The British claimed today their ground and air forces have killed at least 125 terrorists of the anti-White Mau Mau in strikes during the past 10 days.

The colonial government said 53 Mau Maus also had been captured during the period. The security forces lost five men, including one European.

Foreign Sale Of Grain Said Slow

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of Agriculture Benson is finding it difficult to sell surplus wheat abroad even at cut-rate prices.

Three months ago, the secretary sought to stimulate lagging export sales by offering government-owned supplies at reduced prices to markets not covered by an international wheat agreement.

But takers on this offer have been relatively few. The volume shipped abroad under it has been running at less than a million bushels a month from a government-owned surplus of about 350 million bushels.

World wheat supplies are at record levels this year.

Air Force Considering Jet Tankers

 WASHINGTON (AP) — The Air Force may turn to jet-powered tanker planes to provide mid-air refueling for the new B52 all-jet heavy bombers of the Strategic Air Command.

The B52s are expected to begin coming off the production line late this year. Each is being equipped to replenish its fuel supply in flight to offset rate of fuel consumption by its eight thirsty jet engines.

Mid-air refueling for medium B47 jet bombers is standard practice. All tanker planes now used are piston-engined aircraft, the KC97 Boeing Stratofreighter, with tanks and a "flying boom" for transfer of fuel to jet bombers or fighters. Airmen are highly pleased with the current method of replenishing jet bombers and fighters in mid-flight. But they also say that a loss in efficiency, in time and in fuel, will always exist when a jet bomber refuels from a piston-engined tanker. The reason: A jet engine performs best at high altitude, where the air is thin.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Another misfortune has befallen actress Susan Ball, 20, whose right leg was amputated last Jan. 14.

Miss Madeline Benavides, 14, sued her yesterday for \$115,000, claiming she was hurt when the actress' car crashed into the back of hers Oct. 17.

Miss Ball, who plans to resume her film career as soon as she can walk with an artificial leg, first injured the leg two years ago dancing in a movie scene. It was re-injured later. A malignant infection developed and surgeons removed the leg to prevent spread of the malignancy.

In the March 1-2 exchange of civilians, the Reds returned 19 foreigners and received 37 Koreans.

Pyun observed in a statement: "We earnestly desire to have some of our brethren back even if in so doing we may have to lend some sheepskin to the Communist wolf."
