

Senator Flanders Noted In Senate For Plain Talking

WASHINGTON (AP) — When Sen. Ralph E. Flanders (R-Vt.) tongue-lashed Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) in the Senate Tuesday, he wiped out this previous self-appraisal:

"I am a large collection of unspectacular things."

Flanders told the Senate that McCarthy, "by intention or through ignorance," was "doing his best to shatter" the Republican Party.

Flanders' speech was one of the first instances in which a Republican has spoken out so strongly against the Wisconsin Red-hunter, but its bluntness came as no surprise to friends of the onetime Vermont toolmaker.

Despite frequent claims that "I am strictly an amateur in this business" and his comparative newness in politics, Flanders has never been bashful about speaking his mind. In fact, he often has flustered party big-wigs with his frankness.

As a freshman senator at 67—he now is 73—he upset some Republican elders in the 80th Congress by ignoring unwritten law that first terms should be seen but not heard.

Flanders joined some other freshmen in a letter to the Senate Republican leadership demanding a larger share in policy making. They won.

Then Flanders and other GOP juniors suggested to the late Sen. Robert A. Taft (R-Ohio), "Mr. Republican" himself, that in Taft's

McCarthy Hit By Telecast

NEW YORK (AP) — CBS commentator Edward R. Murrow says Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) has been "confusing the public mind" about communism and overstepping the line between "investigating and persecuting."

Murrow added in his telecast Tuesday night that if McCarthy wished to answer these comments, "an opportunity will be afforded him on this program."

The commentator, who is also a member of the CBS board of directors, made his remarks in the midst of a fight by McCarthy to force CBS and NBC to give him free time to answer a speech made last Saturday by Democratic leader Adlai E. Stevenson.

The two networks turned McCarthy down after giving the Republican National Committee time for reply to Stevenson, Vice President Nixon was picked for the job.

Murrow said in his program the need for investigation by congressional committees cannot be denied.

"It is necessary to investigate before legislating," he said. "But the line between investigating and persecuting is a very fine one and the junior senator from Wisconsin has stepped over it repeatedly."

Philippine Head Scraps Slogan

MANILA (AP) — President Ramon Magsaysay Wednesday scrapped the slogan "Asia for the Asians" to express Philippine foreign policy and said "the colonialism that threatens Asia today is world communism."

The president's statement was made at a top level conference of cabinet and congressional leaders called to end a heated debate that shook his young administration.

Magsaysay's statement Wednesday emphasized (1) the Philippines good neighbor policy in Asia is not incompatible with continued friendship with the United States, and (2) every Asian nation has the right to accept or reject assistance from the West.

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Power Groups Eye Damsite

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregonian speculated Wednesday that Pacific Northwest power companies were planning to ask the government for permission to develop the John Day damsite on the Columbia River.

The speculation was touched off by the departure Tuesday night of Thomas W. Delzell, chairman of the board of the Portland General Electric Co., for Washington, D.C.

Other PGE officials were non-committal except that one said a dam at the John Day site would cost some 200 million dollars—more than any single utility in the region could afford.

That led to speculation that other utilities might be interested in joint development of the site.

Pacific Power and Light spokesmen decline to say they were involved but one executive said: "It is well known that the various utilities in the region have been looking at various developments to take care of the region's power needs."

Congress has authorized a federal dam at the site and Army Engineers have drawn up preliminary plans for a high multipurpose dam with power, flood control and navigation features.

Congressional approval would be necessary before the site could be turned over to utilities for private development.

The awards were announced at the annual 101 Club banquet.

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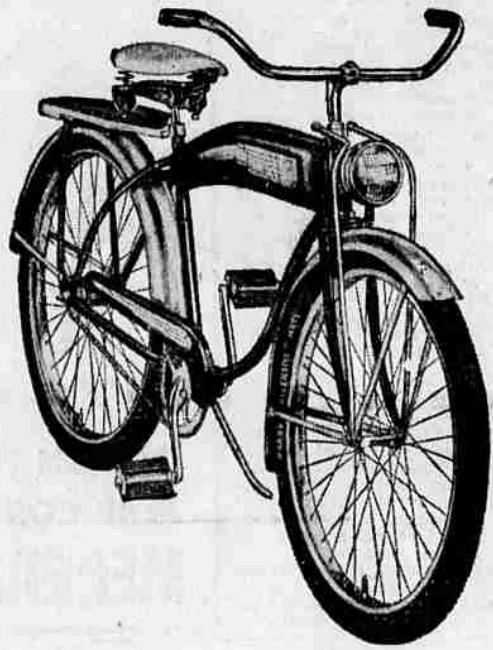
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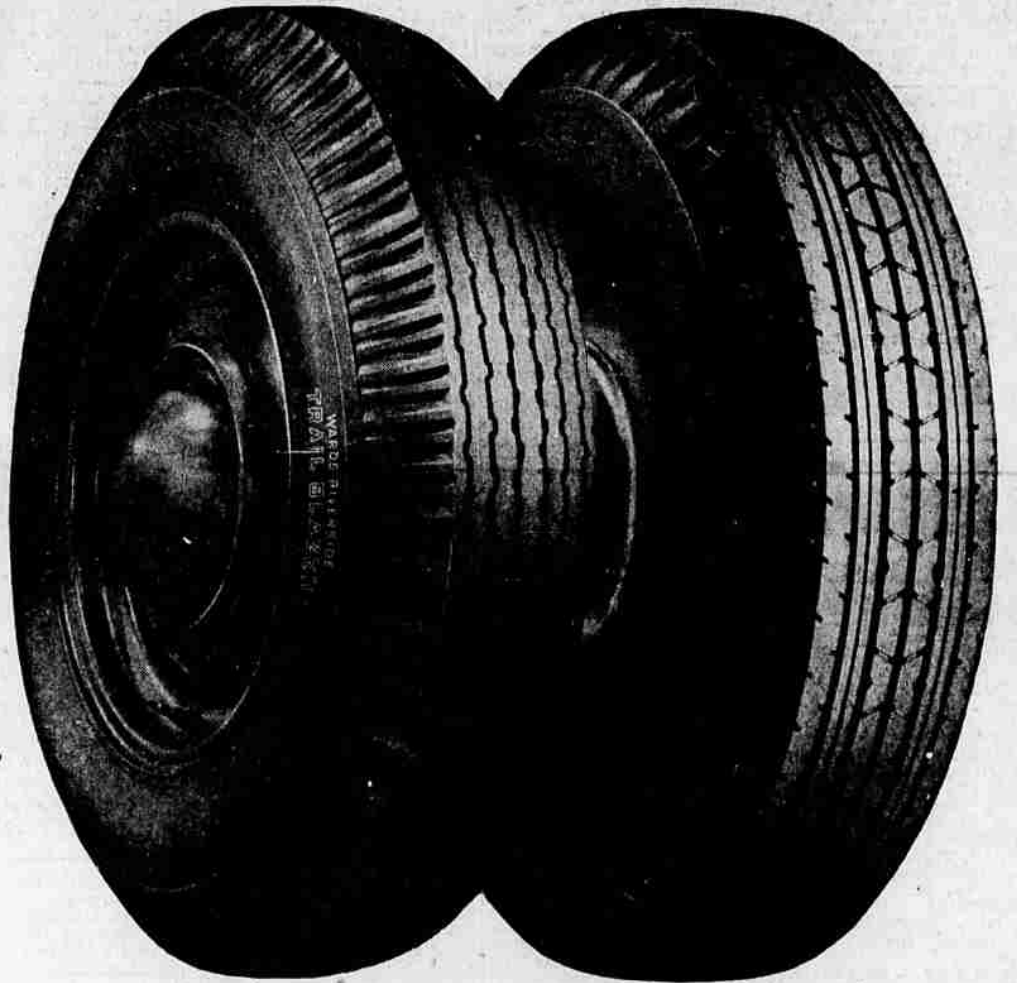
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
