Bible School Choir to Present Sacred Music Concert Tonight

Dr. Willard M. Aldrich, president of Multnomah School of the Bible, brings a brief and timely message in association with the sacred concert to be presented by the Multnomah a cappella choir tonight at 7:30 p.m. in the Bible Baptist Church, 2244 Ward.

Dr. Aldrich is an established author, publisher and public speaker throughout the Northwest. He publishes "The Doorstep Evangelist" and "The Boxholder," monthly publications which go into nearly 40,000 homes in the United States, Canada and Alaska.

Articles from his writings have been reproduced in Gospel tract form in excess of 2,500,000 copies. Contributions from his pen have appeared in such Christian publications as "Moody Monthly," "Sunday School Times," "Christian Life," "The Evangelical Christian," "Christian Digest," "Kings Business" and numerous other magazines.

In addition to his administrative work at the school, Dr. Aldrich has served as pastor of the Emmanuel Baptist Church of Vancouver, Washington, for six years, and prior to that was associate pastor of the Central Bible Church of Port-

land. Multnomah's president lives on a small farm near Vancouver, Washington, with his family of nine children.

The 38 voice choir, under the direction of Lauren B. Sykes, well-known music conductor and organist, will sing numbers from Leisler, Farrant, Bach, Tchaikovsky, Christiansen, Scott, Breton, Mueller and Bron-Wright. The public is cordially invited to attend this special sacred concert. No admission will be charged.

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Presbyterian Moderator Will Be Featured Speaker Here

Dr. John Alexander Mackay, Princeton, New Jersey, moderator of the 165th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States, will be the principal speaker at the First Presbyterian Church, Klamath Falls, Sunday, March 14, at 8 p.m.

Dr. Mackay holds the highest honorary office in the church. The public is invited to attend, according to an announcement from the officials of the Presbyterian Church.

Dr. Mackay is by birth a Scottish highlander, born in Inverness, Scotland, May 17, 1889. He was graduated from the University of Aberdeen in 1912, and received a B.D. degree from Princeton Theological Seminary in 1915. Since that time he has become well known through evangelistic and theological work in Spain, Latin America and the United States.

Kiwanis To Hear Speaker

Kirkpatrick opened a local office for the investment management firm in 1946. After operating it for a year, he was named Southern Oregon manager for the company. SUGGESTION

BONN, Germany (AP)—A Socialist deputy told the German Parliament Friday it's time the Americans started practicing the friendship they claim for the Germans. Deputy Ernest Paul said one good step would be for the U. S. Army to teach "occupation psychology" to troops stationed here.

Following his ordination as a minister of the Free Church of Scotland in 1916, Dr. Mackay went to Peru as a pioneer educational missionary. At Lima, the capital, he founded the Anglo-Peruvian College, which has since become one of the leading Protestant schools in Latin America.

From 1925 to 1932 the educator became an evangelist to the whole of Latin America under the auspices of the South American Federation of the YMCA. Dr. Mackay was called in 1932 to be secretary for Latin America and Africa of the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions. In 1938 he was elected president of Princeton Theological Seminary, the oldest and largest Presbyterian Seminary in the United States.

The administrator served as president of the Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church, USA, from 1944 to 1951. He is also a member of the central committee of the World Council of Churches, and since 1947 has been chairman of the International Missionary Council.

Other offices held by Dr. Mackay have included the following: member of the advisory council of the Department of Philosophy of Princeton University; chairman of the council on Theological Education of the Presbyterian Church, USA; president of the American Association of Theological Schools. Among the honorary degrees held by Dr. Mackay are the following: D.D. from the University of Princeton, University of Aberdeen, Canada; L.L.D. from Ohio Wesleyan University, the College of Worcester and Albright College; L.H.D. from Boston University and Lafayette College.

He is an Honorary Fellow of Stanford University and in 1918 received the degree of Litt.D. from National University of Peru, and later was elected to the chair of philosophy in San Marcos University, Lima. In January of 1953 he received the D.D. degree from Serampore College, India.

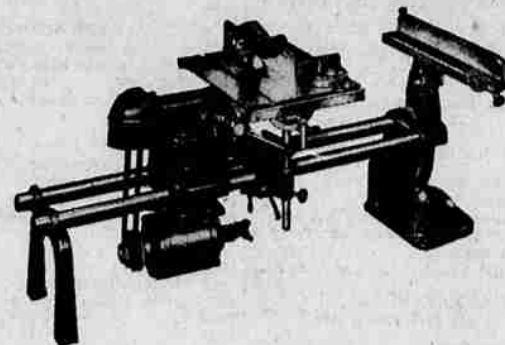
