Parker Underdog To Valdes

NEW YORK (AP)—Strapping Nino Valdes of Cuba is a 3-1 favorite to beat Canadian-born James J. Parker at Madison Square Garden tonight and you never saw a happier underdog.

"The way the favorites have been beaten recently, it's a pleasure to be so lightly regarded," said Parker.

The 5-foot-3, 210-pound Parker, N.J., heavyweight was referring to the string of upsets in the last seven days in television headline fights. Paddy DeMarco whipped lightweight champion Jimmy Carter in the Garden last Friday night at 4-1 odds. Ralph (Tiger) Jones stopped the 2-1 favored Bobby Dykes Monday, and Bobby Jones outpointed Gil Turner (3-1) Wednesday night.

AIR, TV The Parker-Valdes 10-round, starting at 10 p.m., EST, will be broadcast (ABC) and telecast (NBC) locally and nationally.

Valdes also stands 6-3 and weighs 210 pounds. The Cuban champion, ranked as the No. 2 heavyweight contender behind Ezzard Charles, figures to have too much punching power and durability for the transplanted Canadian.

Nino has won six in a row since July 18, including a decision win over Charles and a four-round knockout of Heinz Neuhaus, the European champion from Germany. The Cuban's record is 29-8-1 with 20 knockouts. He was stopped twice early in his career in Havana.

PUNCHER Parker, 25, is a good puncher with his right hand but there is some doubt about his ability to take a strong wallop. He hasn't fought many top fighters in 32 starts. His outstanding victory was a disputed decision over Jimmy Slade, the high-ranking light heavyweight.

The former soldier, oilwell driller, cowboy and farmhand has won nine in a row since April 14, seven of them by kayos. His over-all record is 26-2-2 with 22 knockouts. On the basis of their fighting styles and records, this should be a punching bee as long as it lasts.

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Talents Lose In Opener

SALEM (AP) — Undeclared Ione, winning its 24th consecutive game, and Elgin, Powers and Harrisburg Thursday swept into the Oregon Class B high school tournament semi-finals.

Ione scored 20 points in the fourth quarter to down a stubborn Mill City team 65-50 in the final game of the opening round. Mill City had held the favorites to a 26-20 tie at halftime and trailed only 45-43 at the third quarter mark.

Elgin, tourney finalist last year, overcame a 31-28 halftime deficit to defeat Talent 58-48 and win the right to play Ione in the 9 p.m. Friday nightcap.

RALLY Bob "Red" Walker scored 12 points of his team's 13 in the closing minutes to give Powers a 49-47 victory over Knappa in overtime in the second afternoon game.

The win put Powers in the first semi-final game against Harrisburg which defeated Heppner 60-50 in the meet opener. The game set a tournament record for fouls.

Officials whistled 58, two more than a mark set in a 1950 game. Elton Gregory of Mill City was high scorer of the first round with 21 points, but Duane Baker, an Ione rival, was right behind with 26.

Ever Kumpula, Knappa guard, registered 22 points in his team's loss to Harrisburg. Walker got 21.

GUARDS Elgin was paced by its two guards, Ronnie Miller with 18 points and Ed Hug with 15.

Third high scorer of the round was Dewayne Crabb of Harrisburg who recorded 23 points in leading his team to the win over Heppner. His team-mate, Terry Woods, made 19.

The results made certain an east-west final. Friday Powers and Harrisburg meet from Western Oregon at 7:30, Elgin and Ione, Eastern Oregon teams, are scheduled at 9 p.m. In consolation contests Heppner and Knappa play at 2:30 p.m. and Talent and Mill City will meet at 4 p.m.

Newell Gets Cal Cage Job

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) — Pete Newell, who coached San Francisco to the National Invitation Tournament championship in 1949 and later moved to Michigan State, is California's new basketball coach. Cal Thursday signed Newell to a three-year contract starting July 1.

Newell succeeds the veteran Clarence (Nibs) Price, forced into retirement this spring by California's compulsory 65-age limit. Price has been at Cal 30 years.

Newell, whose Michigan State Spartans had a 4-10 record in the Big Ten this season, welcomed the jump to the Pacific Coast Conference as "a wonderful opportunity." But, said he in Chicago, he leaves MSC with sincere regret.

At Cal, 6-6 in the PCC this season, Athletic Director Brutus Hamilton called Newell "an extremely sound technician, an inspiring leader."

Fairview Ends Bright Season With Victory

Rolling to a season-climaxing 36-28 victory over Pelican School Wednesday afternoon, the Fairview "A" basketball team closed out one of the most successful seasons in the school's history.

The victory over the Pelican team gave Coach Dick Scott's Fairview squad a victory skein of 11 straight wins against elementary schools since dropping an opening encounter to Conger. Trojans, Santa Clara NCAA Picks Tonight

CORVALLIS, Ore. (AP) — Two California teams go up against the best from the Mountain states in the opening round of the Far West regional NCAA basketball tournament here Friday night.

The first game sends the surprise team of the Coast Conference, Southern California, against the equally surprising champion of the Rocky Mountain Conference, Idaho State, at 7:30 p.m. PST.

The second game features Colorado A&M, Skyline Conference champion, and Santa Clara, California entry making its third straight appearance in this playoff.

The winners will meet Saturday night for the right to enter the NCAA finals at Kansas City.

DISMAL Southern California got off to a dismal start this season, but came with a rush at the end to edge UCLA for the title in the Southern Division of the Coast Conference and then defeated Oregon State in a conference playoff.

The Southern California record now is 18-12, but Coach Forrest Twogood's squad is favored over Idaho State because of more height and defensive excellence.

One of Twogood's former players, Steve Belko, who was a star at the University of Idaho when Twogood coached there 14 years ago, coaches the Idaho State team.

LITTLE CHANCE Idaho State nearly made the playoff last year but lost in a qualifying round to Seattle. This year Idaho State again met Seattle in a qualifying round and was given little chance to win—but turned the trick through sensational long-range shooting.

Idaho State's record is 21-4. Santa Clara generally is favored over Colorado A&M in the second game because this veteran team won the regionals two years ago, got to the finals last year and returned this time with virtually the same lineup. The team record is 17-6.

Santa Clara also has a height edge over the Skyline champions but some of the experts here believe this game may be exceedingly close. Colorado A&M, with a 23-5 record, has considerable backboard strength and a high-scoring big man, center Dennis Stuehm, 6-7.

Most observers, however, believe that the agile Ken Sears, 6-6 Santa Clara player, who roves from forward to pivot spot, will provide the margin of difference.
