Local Firm Remodeled

A remodeling program that started before Christmas last year at J. W. Kerns Oregon, Ltd., 731 South Sixth, will be completed early next month.
April 9 has been set for open house at the store which sells "anything from teacups to tractors."
In addition to remodeling, the store has installed a complete self-service system with two checkers, making it Klamath Falls' first self-service hardware and appliance store. By moving the firm's offices to space not previously used, 2,500 square feet of additional display space has been added.
The entire job of modernizing and remodeling was done by the staff.
"We're proud of the fact that we did the work ourselves and this year's expenditures on remodeling amount to only \$1000," stated Ben Kerns, head of hardware and promotions for the store. His assistant, Lucella Kucera, is given credit for being the "guiding light" in the redecorating and painting of the store. Joe Overton, shop foreman, has been responsible for all the carpenter work. The other two dozen staff members helped when they could take time from other duties.
The public is invited to the open house on April 9.

Aid Offered Atom Victims

TOKYO (AP)—The United States today offered top-flight American medical aid to 23 Japanese fishermen burned and blistered by ashes from a supersecret U.S. test blast in the Pacific.
U.S. Ambassador John Allison also proposed a joint Japanese-American investigation of the March 1 incident in the Bikini-Enewok test region.
Only one of the 23 crewmen was considered in dangerous condition when their boat arrived Sunday but all had entered a hospital today. Three were added to the serious list but doctors said they expect all 23 will live.
The intensity of their burns—skin blackening and hair falling out—and their story of the blast stirred speculation that the March 1 test may have been a thermonuclear (probably hydrogen) explosion. The crewmen's reports indicate they were about 80 miles from the blast center.
The U.S. Embassy said a team of three American and three Japanese doctors associated with the atomic bomb casualty commission in the atom-bomb city of Hiroshima will treat the victims.
Allison's offer was the first official comment from the United States on the incident.

Icy Pavement Causes Smash

An elderly couple was treated for minor injuries and released from the hospital Tuesday morning, following a two-car accident at the Lakeview-Merrill junction.
Hospitalized were Mr. and Mrs. S. W. Moss, 2345 Radcliffe, who were traveling east on highway 86, when, according to Oregon State Police, a car operated by Neil Witting, of Route 2, skidded on icy pavement and crashed into the front end of the Moss car.
Taken to Klamath Valley Hospital by Kaler's Ambulance Service, the injured couple was found to be not seriously hurt.

REFUGEES

BERLIN (AP)—More than 20,000 East Germans have fled the Soviet Zone and asked for political asylum in Allied West Germany since the start of the year, West Berlin authorities reported Wednesday.

Japanese Premier Plans World Tour

TOKYO (AP)—Prime Minister Shigeru Yoshida plans to visit England, France, West Germany, Italy, India and the United States this year.
Japan's ambassador to Great Britain, Shunichi Matsumoto told of the plans after a visit to Yoshida's home today.
Matsumoto said Yoshida probably would leave for the United States in mid-May.

Senators Continue Lengthy Attack On Statehood Bills

WASHINGTON (AP)—Southern senators skilled in the art of lengthy debate today continued their attack on statehood for Hawaii and Alaska.
Sen. Daniel (D-Tex) was prepared to take over where Sen. Eastland (D-Miss) left off last night.
Eastland occupied the Senate floor for nearly four hours yesterday in what he said was the "pinnacle" to a discussion of his theme that Communists dominate the political and economic life of the Hawaiian Islands.
The Mississippi senator announced that he plans to speak for "three or four days."
Sen. Smathers (D-Fla.), a leader in the opposition to the combined Hawaii-Alaska statehood bill, told a reporter there will be no filibuster in an effort to prevent a Senate vote. But he said he does not believe there is a chance for a vote "on anything" in the Senate this week.
He said an amendment proposing commonwealth status for Hawaii and Alaska as a substitute for statehood probably will be offered in the Senate tomorrow.
He said it will be sponsored by Senators Monroney (D-Okla.), Fulbright (D-Ark), Butler (R-Md), Malone (R-Nev), Daniel, Smathers and others.
The commonwealth proposal would give the two territories the present status of Puerto Rico—with right to elect their own governors and the privilege of retaining federal tax collections for local use.
