### Alturas Indian Reports on Meet

ALTURAS — Errin Forrest of Alturas, chairman of the California Indian Delegation, has just returned from a trip to Washington, D. C., where he met with some 300 delegates representing 200,000 Indians from the 48 states. Forrest and other Indian delegates drew up resolutions and were given hearings in connection with a bill before Congress, proposing termination of Federal supervision over trust lands and federal services to the Indians through the state by way of education and health.

### Alturas Indian Reports on Meet

Forrest says the Indians are mostly uneducated. From his own particular group there are no college graduates and only 12 with high school diplomas — and they are not equipped mentally or financially to cope with society, and have no knowledge of how to prepare that which they now have. According to Forrest, the Indians feel they would be "turned loose from their lands," freedom from government supervision would eventually mean loss of their lands and the rights they now have. Ninety per cent of their lands are unproductive, but land means everything to the Indians — money nothing. The Indians, said Forrest, feel no bill should be passed without their consent.
