GOP Leaders Critical Of McCarthy

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) and several leading Senate colleagues apparently disagree over what role McCarthy should play while his investigations subcommittee looks into his quarrel with the Army.

Sen. Knowland of California, the Senate majority leader, and Sen. Ferguson of Michigan, chairman of the Senate GOP Policy Committee, say McCarthy should step aside completely as a subcommittee member while the probe is under way. Democratic Senators McClellan of Arkansas and Symington of Missouri, both subcommittee members, voice similar views.

McCarthy, who has agreed to step down temporarily as chairman, says he wants to cross-examine witnesses although he plans not to vote "on any final decisions or conclusions" of the group.

CHAVEZ — Democrats count on their hairline majority in the Senate to beat down a Republican move to unseat Sen. Chavez (D-NM) because of alleged irregularities in the 1952 New Mexico election.

ST. LAWRENCE — The Senate-passed bill to allow U.S. participation in building the St. Lawrence seaway comes up before a key group, the House Rules Committee. The committee, which passes on

what measures should go to the House for final action, may favor the project largely because President Eisenhower has endorsed it.

Two Men Dead In Air Crash

BELLINGHAM (AP)—A light plane crashed and burned 25 miles northeast of here on the Mt. Baker highway Saturday, killing two Bellingham men, Rollin Wood, 33, and Wayne W. Craig, 29.

Witnesses said the plane nosed to the ground shortly after taking off from a small field near Maple Falls, Wood, the pilot, and Craig had rented the plane from the Bellingham Flying Service.

They had been searching for Wood's brother-in-law Edward F. Johnstone, whose car was found in the Nooksack River nearly two weeks ago. Johnstone has been missing since March 6.

Craig was employed by the Columbia Valley Lumber Co. here and Wood was an assistant engineer for the Pacific American Fisheries of Bellingham.

Joseph J. Prince, supervising general safety agent for the Civil Aeronautics Administration, was conducting an investigation of the mishap.

Dangers Of War Pointed Out

DUESSELDORF, Germany (AP)—Prof. Herman Oberth, inventor of the German V2 rocket in World War II, believes atomic weapons developed in the next year will be so dangerous no nation will dare start a war.

Oberth, honorary president of German Society for Space Research, told the group last night that 12 more months of research will make it possible for rockets loaded with atomic bombs to devastate any spot on earth within 45 minutes.

"This means," he said, "that in case of war all big cities of the enemy can be destroyed within two or three hours. Personally, I definitely believe that then no minister will decide himself for a war because he would sign his own death sentence at the same time."

Missing Plane Found In Arctic

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (AP)—U.S. Air Force officials said last night a C-47 missing since last Wednesday has been spotted on a Greenland glacier. Five crewmen and two civilian scientists aboard were reported safe.

The plane, equipped with arctic survival equipment, had made an emergency landing after running out of fuel. Search planes located it 200 miles north its base at Thule, Greenland, Saturday.
