

CIO Against Proposed Laws For Screening Red Members

NEW YORK (AP)—The CIO Executive Board wants the government to stay out of the fight against possible Communist influence in labor unions.

Proposed laws for government screening to catch any Communists in unions would "certainly not help" the CIO's own fight against Communists, the board declared yesterday in a statement at the close of its quarterly meeting.

CIO President Walter P. Reuther later told a news conference "there is no magic formula" for getting rid of Communist elements. "You've got to outwork them, out-

These are English words, honest, though most of them are slang. You can find them—and a lot more you may need if you're London-bound—in a recently published book, "A Dictionary of New Words in English," by Paul C. Berg (Crowell, \$2.95).

Butte Valley SCD Reports

(Editor's note—This is the last of the director items on "Know Your Butte Valley SCD" and includes information on the program of assistance provided farmers and ranchers within the District.)

As mentioned in the first of the published items, pertaining to the SCD annual report, a total of 129 farmers owning or operating 90,454 acres of land are now co-operators in the SCD.

Farm plans and programs of assistance in carrying out sound soil and water conservation practices are being carried on by each of these farmers and ranchers. It is the SCD director's objective that every farmer and rancher avail himself of the opportunity of becoming an SCD cooperator.

Chairman Walt Robinson of the board of directors points out that the SCD soil and water conservation program is designed to meet the needs of local farmers. The affairs of the district are entirely in the hands of the farmers of the district and they are administered locally. Each director has the responsibility of working toward the betterment of soil and water conservation practices within the SCD.

The SCD program of assistance includes soil information, watershed development programs, engineering assistance on drainage and irrigation problems, range and pasture development program and overall program of assistance in cropping and livestock operations.

The district has available, at nominal rental fees, equipment which can be of use to farmers in carrying out conservation practices within the SCD. The SCD owned and operated land leveling equipment has been used for a number of years at a marked saving to farmers in land leveling costs.

The Board of Directors hold their regular meetings the second Monday of each month at the BCD office in Macdonel. The meetings begin at 8 p.m. and the board welcomes farmer attendance at the meetings and also any suggestions for improvement of the SCD program of work.

Senator Wants Geneva Talk Confined To Korea Problem

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. George (D-Ga.) proposed today that the United States refuse to discuss the Indochina question with the Chinese Reds at Geneva and concentrate on seeking a Korean settlement.

George, senior Democrat on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, said in an interview he is opposed to giving the Chinese Communists even the implied recognition he contended is involved in negotiating with them on problems of an area where their troops are not directly involved.

In that connection, he said the Senate ought to be represented in a bipartisan way at next month's five-power meeting at Geneva, Switzerland, to bolster the administration's expressed determination not to let Red China into the United Nations.

Chairman Wiley (R-Wis.) of the Foreign Relations Committee agreed the Senate ought to be represented.

"It would be a good opportunity to learn the changing facts of the world at first hand," he said.

Secretary of State Dulles told his news conference yesterday he has made no decision whether to invite a bipartisan congressional group to go with him to Geneva. He said he expects to discuss this soon.

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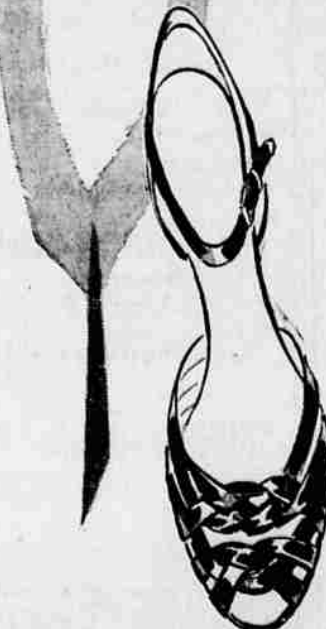
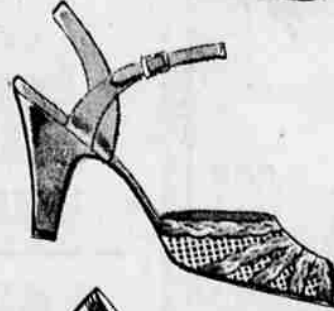
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
