### U.S. Climbers Near Mountain

**NEW DELHI, India** — A 10-man California mountain climbing team was reported Wednesday trekking through Nepal towards the jumping-off place for its planned assault on unclimbed Mt. Makalu, the world's fourth highest peak.

A five-day-old message received here from Dr. William Siri, the leader, said the Californians expected to set up their base camp March 31 at Barun Khola, 16,000 feet up the side of the mountain.

Siri reported that all members of the team were in the best of health and spirits despite the dry heat of the Arun River Valley through which they were pushing at the time. Twelve Sherpa guides and 250 porters, carrying equipment, were accompanying the Californians.

Two other Himalayan expeditions, meanwhile, began assembling at Bombay for assaults on other peaks in the vast range. An eight-man New Zealand group, to be led by Sir Edmund Hillary, conqueror of Mt. Everest, plan an attempt on three peaks in the Barun Valley some 33 miles south-east of Everest. All three are more than 22,000 feet high.

A seven-man British team will survey 28,145-foot Kanchanjunga, third highest mountain in the world. If the reconnaissance is successful, a full-scale assault will be made later. Four peracous died in the first attempt to scale Kanchanjunga in 1905.
