Coach Len Surles was greeted by eight returning lettermen and poor weather conditions when he issued the call for this year's Klamath Union High School track team.

This is Surles' first year as head track coach although he has served on the high school coaching staff since 1948. He succeeds Paul Deller.

Jim Bevans, Dave Peppie and Don Mills will lead the Pel cinder team in the sprints and relays. Bevans and Peppie will also be entered in the hurdles and broad-jump events respectively.

The distance events will be handled by Barry Pitts and Don Wells.

Orin Perkins, with Peppie a sophomore, is likely to supply the punch for the Pels in the high jump.

All of the returning lettermen, with the exception of Peppie and Perkins, are seniors.

Another returning letterman, Guy Munsell, will miss this year's track season because of a recent knee operation.

According to Surles, the sprints, relays, weights, and broadjump will be the strong points on the team, while the javelin and pole vault are causing the biggest problem.

The first meet will be a triangle contest with Roseburg - Eugene-Klamath at Roseburg April 3. Assisting Surles this year will be Bob Hendershot who also served in that capacity under Deller.

Oregon Hunters Third In Nation on Deer Kill Toll

Oregon placed third with 78,170 deer killed.

In total number of big game animals of all species killed, Oregon ranked fourth, being surpassed by the two previously mentioned states and Wyoming. Wyoming has a large kill of all varieties and leads the nation in number of antelope harvested.

Considering elk alone, Oregon again ranks fourth in the nation, being surpassed by Idaho, Montana, and Wyoming in that order.

A comparison of the number of big animals killed with hunting license sales, shows that approximately 30 per cent of the hunting license holders bagged big game animals. Utah and Wyoming hunters were slightly over 61 per cent successful.

Though the deer kill figures for 1953 have not yet been compiled, indications are that it will exceed the 1952 kill, and all reports show that deer herds are in excellent condition following a favorable winter.

Wet Grounds Stop Beavers

NEW YORK (AP) - A lot of action and upsets in the past month Friday resulted in a major shakeup of almost every division in the latest Ring Magazine ratings.

Tommy (Hurricane) Jackson, 22-year-old Brooklyn heavyweight who stopped Rex Layne and beat Clarence Henry, gained his first position in the top ten. He took over the No. 7 spot and Bill Gilman of East Orange, N. J., No. 10 as Henry and Harry (Kid) Matthews of Seattle were dropped out of the rankings.

Young Paul Andrews of Buffalo, N. Y., who made a good showing against Harold Johnson, was moved up from nine to seven in the light heavyweight division. Danny Nardico of Tampa, Fla., fell from seventh to ninth.

Dal Dower, the tiny Welshman who knocked out Terry Allen, former world flyweight champion, was made the No. 3 112-pound contender. Dower was eighth last month. Allen skidded from fourth to seventh.

Scholz Makes U.S. Debut

NEW YORK (AP) - Germany's Gustav (Bubi) Scholz hopes to score a decisive victory in the ring Friday night when he faces Al Andrews of Superior, Wis., in Madison Square Garden.

Although he is making his U.S. debut, the unbeaten, 23-year-old Berlin middleweight, has been made a 3-1 favorite to whip the promising 23-year-old Midwesterner in the ten rounder.

NBC will telecast the bout locally and nationally while ABC will handle the radio broadcast.

The odds are surprisingly big on a fighter who is making his first appearance, even though his record shows 40 wins, no losses, two draws and 28 knockouts. He has won nine in a row, eight by knockouts.
