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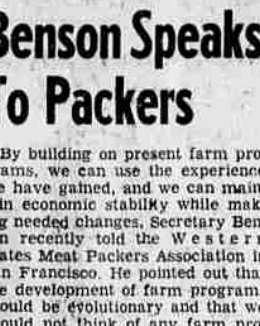
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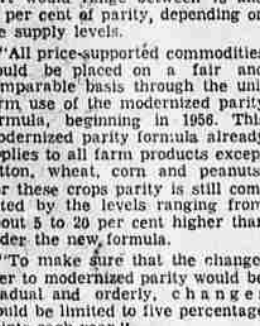

Civil War Vet Honored In Texas
AUSTIN, Tex. (AP)—Walter Williams, the nation's oldest surviving Civil War veteran, is going to be honorary commander of Berstrom Air Force Base here Sunday.

The 111-year-old former forage master in Hood's Brigade will once more be clad in the gray of the Confederate army. But this time, Hollywood had to help. The Air Force borrowed a uniform from Paramount studios and flew it here.

Discussing President Eisenhower's recommendations for a new farm program, the secretary said: "The new program would use variable or adjustable price supports for all supported commodities beginning in 1955... It would institute variable supports for all the basic commodities, except tobacco. The support would range between 75 and 90 per cent of parity, depending on the supply levels."

"All price-supported commodities would be placed on a fair and comparable basis through the uniform use of the modernized parity formula, beginning in 1958. This modernized parity formula already applies to all farm products except cotton, wheat, corn and peanuts. For these crops parity is still computed by the levels ranging from about 5 to 20 per cent higher than under the new formula."

"To make sure that the change-over to modernized parity would be gradual and orderly, changes would be limited to five percentage points each year."

Unusual Excuse Given By Driver
TOLEDO, Ohio (AP)—Municipal Judge Geraldine MacElwane says the excuse offered yesterday by Paul A. Kroyer, 19, for running a red traffic light was the most original ever heard in her court.

Just as he was about to stop for the red light, the youth related, his 6-month-old pet wildcat, sitting on the seat beside him, toppled off and landed beneath the brake pedal.

"I didn't dare push down the brake pedal on him," Kroyer said. Fine: \$5 and costs.



Air Force Tries New Food System
ENID Okla. (AP)—Tough old mess sergeants and KP, scourge of rookie servicemen, are on their way out at the Vance Air Force Base.

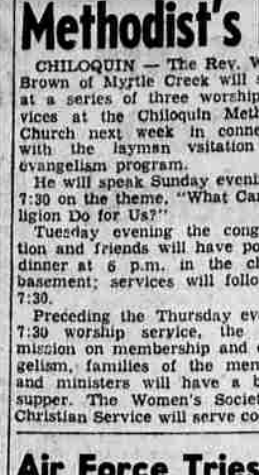
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
