## Bridge Survey Plans Told

PORTLAND — Oregon will pay part of the cost of a survey for a bridge over the Columbia River at Astoria, if Washington also will pay a share, the Oregon State Highway Commission decided Friday.

The survey, to be made by the Tudor Engineer Co. of San Francisco, and Coverdale and Colpitts, New York, would cost \$30,000. Plans call for this to be apportioned among the Port of Astoria, Pacific County, Wash., the Oregon State Highway Department and the Washington State Bridge Authority. Each would pay \$12,500.

The survey would take about six months.

If the survey shows that a bridge is feasible, plans call for the Port of Astoria to build the bridge, financing it by sale of revenue bonds. The bridge would be turned over to joint ownership and maintenance by Oregon and Washington Highway departments after construction costs were repaid.

## Teacher Leaves South Estate

SOUTH GATE, Calif. — A Los Angeles city school teacher has left an estate of more than a million dollars.

Olaf Halvorson, a Norwegian immigrant, joined the Los Angeles schools in 1917 and taught Latin, Spanish and social studies. School officials said he retired on a "very small pension."

His attorney, Robert Mize, said Halvorson built his \$1,049,400 fortune from his modest savings as a teacher.

"He made his first sizeable stake in oil-rich Santa Fe Springs holdings," Mize added. "But the major portion was built up through careful investments over the years."

The bulk of the estate goes to Halvorson's widow, Sophie. He died Aug. 8 and his will was filed in court yesterday.

## EVANGELIST

LONDON — At the end of the fifth week of his religious crusade in London, American evangelist Billy Graham maintained a pace which amazed British church men. The attendance at his jammed meetings at the Harrington arena is up to the half-million mark. There was no sign of abatement in interest.

## Adlai Attacks Republican Record In Southern Speech

CHARLOTTE, N. C. (AP) — Adlai Stevenson said last night the Republicans should stop calling names and start tackling problems that confront us.

In a 45-minute address to more than 2,500 cheering North Carolina Democrats, the 1952 presidential candidate listed the Indochina War, growing unemployment, threat of atomic war and America's economic future as grave problems facing the nation today.

Stevenson referred to "the frustration of the (Republican) legislative program, the division, the feuding, the name calling, the limboing, and the impotence" as a "distasteful spectacle." He then questioned "whether the Republican party is capable of governing the nation or whether its irresponsible opposition in the past has laid it off for the present."

He said "the ghastly (hydrogen bomb) explosions . . . have pointed up the imperative necessity for desperate efforts to control the unknown demons that lurk in the atom. And yet for weeks and weeks our national life is preoccupied with the discharges of quarrel over the discharge of a dentist by the Army . . . and we wait from day to day to decide who is lying about this."

Accusing the Eisenhower administration of resorting to slogans and sales campaigns, he charged that the nation has not been "getting straight talk from our leaders."

The former Illinois governor said the administration has used "this merchandising technique" to get headlines over the announced withdrawal of the 7th Fleet from Formosa, over "howling about the secret sell-out at Yalta and Potsdam" and over talk about a "bold, new dynamic foreign policy of 'liberation' for Eastern Europe."

Yes, he asserted, all these programs came to naught.

"We will have to make his choice between uniting his party and uniting his nation. So long as his party is constituted as it is at present, he cannot do both."

He noted the division within his own party in 1952 and said "more and more Southern Democrats" are returning to the party "after a taste of government by men whose chief qualification for office seems to be the accumulation of large fortunes during times of Democratic prosperity . . .

"For my part, the lost sheep are welcome back," he said he respected the motive "of those who strayed—both going and coming. But I hope the South won't

get the habit of issuing round-trip tickets."

Stevenson's address was arranged by Democrats launching a campaign to oust the state's only Republican congressman, Rep. Charles Raper Jones, who picked up Democratic votes while Eisenhower was carrying Charlotte and the 10th District.

Turning to the Republican tax program, Stevenson said congressional Democrats "want to halt the recession . . . and to stop the growing unemployment . . . they propose to do this by giving tax relief to low-income families, thus placing spending money in the hands of consumers who must spend to live."

There are two choices, he asserted, in solving the country's economic future. One, he continued, "is to hide in terror from the facts" which point out the need of three million more jobs immediately, a 20% increase of America's expanding population, seven million new jobs by 1960.

"The other choice," Stevenson went on, "is more exhortation. We have as a people . . . every asset we need to create a fuller life for every American in every year of our foreseeable future."

He said he feared the Republicans have chosen "the first alternative and will take . . . perhaps unconsciously the low road leading to a stagnant economy."

## Medford Hears Wayne Morse

MEDFORD (AP) — A "massive retaliation against recession" is needed in Oregon and throughout the nation, Sen. Wayne Morse said Friday.

Morse, who bolted the Republican party to become an independent, told approximately 500 persons who attended the fourth annual Franklin D. Roosevelt Memorial dinner that a public works program would help.

He called for construction of roads, schools and hospitals and for "full and prompt" development of the region's hydroelectric resources.

"At the minimum, John Day Dam and Ice Harbor should be

put under construction at the earliest possible moment. Certainly the Dalles and Chief Joseph dams should be kept on schedule," he said.

He called for election of a Democratic Congress. "Give us Democrats we can work with who will not go along with (Secretary of the Interior) McKay's private utility grab. And give us a senator and congressman who will work for Hella Canyon," he said.

Howard Morgan, state Democratic chairman, was toastmaster. Joseph K. Carson, Portland attorney and Democratic candidate for governor, introduced Morse.
