Dulles Backs Foreign Aid

WASHINGTON (AP)—Secretary of State Dulles opens today the administration's fight to keep a foreign aid program alive, though cut down.

The secretary takes his case to the House Foreign Affairs Committee, an arm of a budget-slashing Congress growing visibly impatient with some European allies.

President Eisenhower has said he will request \$1.5 billion dollars in continuing foreign aid until mid-1955—a cut of \$1 billion dollars from last year. The details may not reach Congress until next month.

Dulles testifies publicly on the Dulles range of overseas operations and elaborates with security information afterward in a closed session.

One of Dulles' major tasks may be to convince Congress to wait longer for France and Italy to ratify the European Defense Community.

Acting Chairman Vorys (R-Ohio) says the current daily hearings, lasting through April 15, are intended to give the committee a broad look at foreign affairs. It probably will consider actual foreign aid legislation next month.

In general, Congress is expected to support greater aid for Indochina and the rest of Southeast Asia. Both the President and Dulles insist this area must be saved.

But Rep. Gordon (D-Ill.) said Congress will get more impatient with European allies that "don't do enough for themselves."

Councilman Harvey Denham and Paul Lewis reported on their inspection of city lights and poles. They recommended the installation of four new pole two on Grant Street, one on Grant and second and one on Grand and third; also that new 220 watt bulbs be installed replacing the 100 watt bulbs now in use on some of the back streets. C. A. Boyer, California Oregon Power Company representative, informed the council that the company will request an estimate from the power company on the cost of the new poles and lights.
